### **Summary**

Moubani Bagchi is a PhD student, specializing in Archaeology, at the Department of Humanities and Social Sciences, Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati. Her work integrates interdisciplinary methods from domains of heritage conservation and cultural resource management for understanding the issues and challenges faced by the urban cultural heritage.
