Sh Rakesh Ranjan, Additional Secretary (HE) MoE, and Commissioner & Secretary to the Government of Assam, could not attend the meeting due to unavoidable commitments and they were granted leave of absence.

Director welcomed and introduced Prof. Tamal Banerjee, Department of Chemical Engineering to the Board as the new Senate nominee to the BOG for 2(Two) years.

Hon'ble Chairman, BOG welcomed all the members present in the meeting and proposed that the presentations be made under Item No.1 and 2 before taking up the agenda of the day.

The Board was also informed about the receipt of comments on the Agenda of 110th BOG meeting of IIT Guwahati from the Ministry of Education vide F No 6-8/2018-TS-I dated 28.03.2022. {Copy at <u>Annexure-1</u>(pg no.48-51)}

Before taking up the agenda of the day, Director of the Institute gave a brief A/V presentation on the activities carried out in the Institute in the post Covid scenario highlighting the following points:

- Reopening of Institute in full by bringing back all students in campus in four phases starting from 19th February 2022 and the start of physical offline classes from 21st March 2022 with more than 7000 students in the campus.
- The Virasat annual cultural extravaganza of SPIC MACAY IIT Guwahati was held offline from 8-10 March 2022 in the campus showcasing the diverse range of artist from folk to classical and from dance to music across the different parts of our country.

- Annual cultural festival of IIT Guwahati Alcheringa, 2022 was inaugurated on 11th March 2022 and conducted in the hybrid mode.
- > Spardha, an inter hostel sports event started from 25th March 2022 in the campus
- Chemical Research Society of India's 28th National Symposium in Chemistry was held offline in IIT Guwahati from March 25-27th 2022.
- IIT Guwahati inaugurated a 100 days' yoga festival from March 28 to June 21,2022 on the occasion of 8th International Yoga Day (IDY) June 21,2022.

Thereafter, the agenda for the day was taken up as listed below:

Presentations by Head, Biosciences and Bioengineering, and Head, Nanotechnology

The Board of Governors of the Institute in its 108th Meeting held on 25.10.2021 suggested the Heads of two or three Departments/Sections alternatively to make brief audio/visual presentations to showcase the achievements of the Departments/Centre/Schools including their plans, innovations, and contribution to the Nation in general and the North East in particular.

Accordingly, 2(Two) power point-point presentations of about 15 minutes each were delivered by Head, Biosciences and Bioengineering and Head, Centre for Nano technology before the BOG showcasing the recent activities, achievements and plans of the respective Department/Centre

Both the presentations emphasised on the following topics:

- Thrust areas of research
- Notable achievements of students
- Achievements of the faculty members of the Department
- Brief account of the diverse research areas where faculty members of the respective Department are actively involved in and their impact.

The Board **NOTED** all the points mentioned in the ppt presented by Head of BSBE and Head of Centre for Nanotechnology. The Board also appreciated the efforts of both the Dept. /Centre of BSBE and Nanotechnology and congratulated both the Heads for the outstanding work done by the Department /Centre.

The Board further **OPINED** that, Institute should focus more on collaborative research to bring distinct expertise to the thrust research area.

Item No,2

The Report on NEP implementation in IIT Guwahati roadmap

The Board was apprised that, In the 106th meeting of BOG vides resolution R_106BOG/11 B /2021, the Board ACCEPTED the report on Implementation of National Education (NEP) Policy at IIT Guwahati submitted by the committee constituted by the Director on 3rd November 2020 and ADVISED that while implementing the NEP in IIT Guwahati multidisciplinary approach should be encouraged.

Following the decision of the Board, the Senate vide its resolution R.157/10/2021 resolved to constitute following 2 committees for reviewing or aligning the academic programmes of the Institute with NEP 2020.

- 1st Committee to review the overall NEP 2020 implementation by IITG was headed by the Dean of Academic Affairs
- 2nd committee to review all the UG programmes was headed by the Associate Dean of Academic Affairs (UG).

To know the status of implementation of NEP in IIT Guwahati, Prof. Chitralekha Mahanta, Dean of Academic Affairs made a presentation on up to date detailed report on "NEP implementation roadmap in IIT Guwahati" before the Board.

In her presentation Prof. Mahanta highlighted that IIT Guwahati already has a number of inter-disciplinary programmes and several more are in the pipeline. She also updated the Board about the following upcoming interdisciplinary programmes.

- School of Health Science and Technology to start M.Tech programme in Biomedical Science and Engineering with Specialization in Medical Devices and Diagnostics from July 2022.
- > School of Business to start MBA programme from July 2022
- > HSS Department to start M.A in Liberal Arts from July 2022
- School of Energy Science and Engineering to start B. Tech in Energy Engineering from July 2022.
- > INTER DISCIPLINARY PHD PROGRAMME

She also emphasized that, IIT Guwahati has also drawn up a draft policy for Awarding credits to Swayam NPTEL-MOOC Courses as per NEP 2020 recommendation. The main features of the draft policy are:

- Every academic department/centre/school will create a basket of available NPTEL- MOOCs such that every student gets an opportunity to register at least one elective from NPTEL-MOOCs in lieu of departmental/open electives.
- All the existing grading criteria of NPTEL will be followed and mapped suitably to IITG grades.

It was also apprised that at present IIT Guwahati has 11 Departments,7 multi-disciplinary Academic Centres and 5 multi-disciplinary schools. The presentation of Prof. Mahanta is given as <u>Annexure-2</u> (not enclosed)

The Board was requested to **NOTE** the report on NEP implementation roadmap in IIT Guwahati as presented by Dean, Academic Affairs

The Board appreciated the efforts made by IIT Guwahati for implementation of NEP 2020 and **NOTED** all the points presented in the presentation.

The Board also commented that IIT Guwahati has all the essential elements to implement NEP policy in the Institute and has taken the right direction for implementing the same in true spirit. IITs across the country seem to be taking the lead in this process of moving

from single to multi-disciplinary Institutes and IIT Guwahati is also not lagging behind in this endeavor. Further, the Board advised for fixing a timeline for implementation of NEP 2020 in the Institute.

The Ministry of Education vide its letter under reference D.O. No. 33-2/2021-TS-III (Pt.I) dated 24.08.2021, advised to clear the backlog by filling the vacancies in a Mission Mode within a period of one year starting from 05.09.2021 to 04.09.2022, which was placed in the 108th meeting of the BOG with status report. The Ministry also advised to include an agenda item in every Finance Committee/Board of Governors/ Board of Management meeting, giving status of filling up of backlog vacancies.

IIT Guwahati has advertised for special recruitment drive for filling the vacancies in position against reserved categories for all faculty positions.

*It may be mentioned that, as the strength of students keep changing throughout the year, sanctioned faculty strength also changes while calculating in different time of a year. Because of variable nature of data, vacancy positions will also change, making it difficult to keep track of the category-wise vacancy positions. As such, earmarking/calculation of the vacancy positions will be done on the basis of the student's strength (as on 1st April) in the beginning of a particular financial year and use it till the end of that financial year.

<u>ltem No .6</u>

To consider the proposal from the Secretariat of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam for instituting annual awards for meritorious students, one each for students of UG and PG programmes

The Board was apprised that the following item has been APPROVED by the Senate by Circulation dated 10/01/2022.

"As per the letter No. GSA. 133/2021/1 dated 10.12.2021 from the Secretariat of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam, placed in <u>Annexure 7 (pg.63)</u>, the Institute has received a proposal for instituting annual awards for meritorious students, one each for UG and PG programmes in the name of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam and requested to make a proposal along with the scheme and design for the awards.

Considering the norms of the Institute and the existing awards/medals given to the students of IIT Guwahati, Academic Affairs Section deliberated and made a proposal to institute with reference to the two awards:

Award for Postgraduate Students:

Name of the Award: "The Governor of Assam Gold Medal" for Postgraduate Students

Eligibility: The Medal will be awarded each year to the student who secures the highest Cumulative Performance Index among all eligible students of the batch receiving any of the Master's degrees of the Institute. Currently, the programmes are Master of Arts, Master of Science, Master of Business Administration, Master of Technology, Master of Design and Master of Science by Research. However, this will include all the Master's programmes available in the awarding year.

Award for Undergraduate Students:

Name of the Award: "The Governor of Assam Gold Medal" for Undergraduate Students

Eligibility: The Medal will be awarded each year to the student who secures the second highest Cumulative Performance Index among all eligible students of the batch receiving the degrees of Bachelor of Technology and Bachelor of Design. It is to be noted that the student who stands first in the above category is awarded "The President of India Gold Medal".

Endowment Amount: For each of the above-mentioned awards, Rs. 10,00,000/- (Rupees ten lakhs) and above one time or a buffer amount that will earn at least Rs. 1 lakh as annual interest. The excess interests earned (after deducting the award amount) will be added to the endowment to be used to cover drop in interest rates, inflation and growth in future.

Accordingly, the Secretariat of Hon'ble Governor of Assam responded with an acceptance of proposal and sanction of Rs. 20,00,000/- (Rupees twenty lakhs only) as per the letter GSA. 133/2021/32 dated 07.01.2022, placed in <u>Annexure 8</u> (pg.64-65), with a request to name the awards as "Governor Award for Excellence to Meritorious Students".

In view of this, it is proposed to mention in the certificate as "Governor of Assam Gold Medal for Excellence to Meritorious Students", whereas on the medal it will be titled as "Governor of Assam Gold Medal", as shown in design of medals and certificates, as placed in <u>Annexure 9(pg.66-69)</u>.

Further, as the awards are proposed in the name of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam, the Senate may consider it for awarding the same in the annual convocation of the Institute.

Considering the feedback of the members, it is also opined that the student receiving the Governor of Assam Gold Medal for Postgraduate/Undergraduate students will NOT get the Institute Silver Medal, while he/she may be topper of the respective branch/discipline.

For awarding these medals, following tie-breaking rules will be used in the given order:

- 1. Percentage of "AS" grades (obtained over the number of credit courses)
- 2. If required, percentage of "AA" grades, then "AB", etc.
- Percentage of marks or CPI converted to percentage (CPI on 10-point scale, or scaled to 10 points, multiplied by 10) of the preceding degrees/qualifications in the following order:
 - i. Bachelor's degree (even if they have other Master's degrees, only the Bachelor's degree marks will be considered)
 - ii. Class 12
 - iii. Class 10
- 4. If still there is a tie, one who is the youngest (as per the DoB in the records) will be awarded.

The Senate vide resolution R159/14/2022 **RESOLVED** that the proposal from the Secretariat of the Hon'ble Governor of Assam for instituting two annual awards, viz., Governor of Assam Gold Medals for Excellence to Meritorious Students, one each for UG and PG programmes as detailed above be **APPROVED** and **RECOMMENDED** the same be placed in the BOG."

The Committee during their visit to these hospitals discussed the rate of discount offered on the lab investigations, doctors' consultation, and medicines e.t.c. on the OPD treatment offered by them to Institute patients. Following the committee's visit to these hospitals, the hospitals and hospital documents related to their affiliation, license and discount submitted by these hospitals, the committee presented the following points for consideration for the empanelment

Based on the empanelment documents submitted and official visits to the hospitals mentioned above, the Committee entrusted to look into the hospital empanelment recommended that –

(i) the Pratiksha Hospital, Guwahati, (ii) the ASG Eye Care Hospital, Guwahati (both Down Town and Paltan Bazaar Centres) and (iii) the Akanksha Hospital, Guwahati be empanelled under IIT Guwahati for OPD treatment.

The Board was apprised that, the Senate in its 159th Meeting held on 11.02.2022 approved the proposal vide Resolution R159/5/2022 received from the School of Health Science and Technology for starting M Tech programme in Biomedical Science and Engineering with Specialization in Medical Devices and Diagnostics with 20 seats as per recommendation of the 117th IPPC, held on 31st January, 2022.

The Board was also apprised that the Senate examined the proposal of the programme as resolved by the IPPC and approved the same with the following suggestions:

- The programme may include clinical aspects of the courses.
- Mehta Family would provide fellowship to attract top notch students.
- Faculty can visit foreign universities.
- "HT" can be used as prefix for coding the courses instead of "SH".
- Electives to carry the prefix as "XX".
- Course numbers can be allotted to the proposed courses.

The Board was requested to approve the proposal of School of Health Sciences and Technology {as given as <u>Annexure -10</u> (pg.70-71)} for starting M Tech programme in Biomedical Science and Engineering with Specialization in Medical Devices and Diagnostics with 20 seats as per recommendation of the 159th Senate.

Item No 9

To consider the proposal on increase of Hostel mess caution money.

The Board was apprised that the Hostel Services Committee Members in its meeting held on 09.02.2022 recommended to increase the mess caution money from Rs. 3600/- to 6000/- from July-Nov 200 semester onwards and the same was placed in the BOG for approval.

Ministry of Education vide its letter F No 6-8/2018-TS-I dated 28.03.2022, however

commented that the matter may be routed through Finance Committee.

The Board was requested to approve the proposal to increase the mess part of the caution money from existing Rs.3600/- (Rupees Three Thousand Six Hundred only) to Rs 6000/-(Six Thousand Only) from July-Nov 2022 semester onwards.

Following IITB, IITD, IITM, IIT KGP, and IITK, IIT Guwahati has been ranked at 395 by the QS World University Rankings 2022.

Maintaining its consistent seventh position (#7) in NIRF rankings for the last 4 years, IIT Guwahati is again ranked at 7th position in the engineering category by the NIRF 2021 and 8th rank in the overall category.

The institute has been ranked at the same position (#7) by Outlook India too. IIT Guwahati has jumped up by two places in the QS BRICS Ranking (#48) and further showed improvement in THE WEEK Rankings reaching to the sixth position this year.

The Board was also apprised that while nationally IIT Guwahati has been consistent in its rankings its ranking in the world has been dropped by 31 positions in Times Higher Education Asia Ranking as IIT Guwahati did not participate in the Ranking for last two years as decided by all Senior IITs to "boycott' the ranking collectively.

D. Modification of instructions regarding Booking of Air Tickets on Government account.

In pursuance of the Ministry of Education's letter vide F.No 29-8/2022-IFD dated 10.01.2022, the imposition of official travel by Air India is dispensed with in view of disinvestment of Air India by Government of India. As such, employees are entitled to travel by any airline for LTC or any other official purpose with the following conditions:

- 1. In cases of air travel where the Institute bears the cost of air passage, air tickets shall be purchased from any one of the three Authorized Travel Agents, viz:
 - a. M/s BalmerLawrie& Company Limited (BLCL)
 - b. M/s Ashok Travels & Tours (ATT)
 - c. Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation Limited (IRCTC)
- 2. These authorised travel agents are expected to provide to the employees the **'best available fare'** on the date of booking on the basis of tour programme as per their entitlement. A certificate in this regard is to be obtained from the Travel Agent in the enclosed format.
- 3. All Mileage Points earned by employees on tickets purchased for official travel shall be accrued to the Institute. Any usage of these Mileage Points for purpose of private travel by any employee is prohibited.
- 4. No agency charges will be reimbursed to the employees if any such charges are imposed by the booking agencies for booking tickets of the employees which are finally funded by the Institute.
- 5. In unavoidable circumstances where the booking of ticket is done from unauthorized travel agent/ website, the Competent Authority (currently this power is delegated to the Deputy Director of the Institute) may approve the same, if deemed fit.

- 6. As per the extant Institute norms, the employees are to book their air tickets by themselves, as per items above. They may draw advance of the fare for booking the tickets, as per extant rules (if required).
- 7. These revised rules will come into force with immediate effect.

As per clarification received from the Ministry of Finance, Government of India vide Office Memorandum no. 19.24/03/2021-E.IV dated 16.02.2022, the following instructions are to be followed regarding official air travel:

- i. All official air travel where the Institute bears the cost of air passage, air tickets for both domestic (including LTC) and international travel can be made by private airlines.

- 3. Discussed about the impact of pandemic and suggested to bring a mechanism to motivate present less productive faculties to pursue research and take up more project activities. The Committee decided that a suitable review and support mechanism can be worked to address these issues.
- 4. Status report of the filling up of backlog vacancy positions and the implementation of roster with regular recruitment and, suggested to arrive at alternates in case these reserve posts continue to remain vacant for extended time.
- 5. Highlighted the importance of interdisciplinary research and suggested to explore for having of a minimum number of permanent faculty in Centre of Indian Knowledge Systems and agreed to explore the possibilities.

Proposal for M Tech in Biomedical Science and Engineering

Preamble:

The National Education Policy – NEP 2020 has emphasized the necessity of academic programs at the various levels of education, which inculcates multidisciplinary trainings to the students/scholars with a significant stress on the hands-on training. The major objective of such academic curricula includes not only to train and apskill the bright minds of the country with real-life laboratory scale experience but also to improve their employability by connecting their education to the translational activities. In this direction, medical science and technology is one such multidisciplinary field where the scientific, technological, and design interventions from diverse disciplines of engineering, pure science, social science, and design have been significant. For example, the specialties like diagnostics, systems biology, bioinformatics, regenerative medicine, data science and analytics, tissue engineering, stem cell research, public health, and prosthesis, among many others, have found their major footprint in the technological realm in the recent years. In conjunction, with the recent translational initiatives from the Government of India for import replacements such as Atmanirbhar Bharat, Make-in-India and Startup India, it has become imperative to develop human resources ready to be employed in the medical industries, who are capable of producing the next generation of technologies through disruptive inventions and innovations in the multidisciplinary scientific and technological domains.

The proposed Master of Technology curriculum in Biomedical Science and Engineering at the School of Health Sciences and Technology is designed to provide the incoming students a foundation of knowledge related to the modern biomedical technologies within the broader perspective of the health science and technology. The course is designed to offer introductory as well as advanced study modules such as cell biology, immunology, physiology, quality management, biomaterials, biosensors, diagnostic and biomedical devices. The curriculum also offers the courses on research methodology, regulatory aspects of technologies, intellectual property rights, publication and patent writing among others. In the beginning of the curriculum, the students arriving from the diverse disciplines are to be trained with a set of compulsory core courses drawn from different disciplines in the first semester. After the build-up of the foundation through this activity, in the second semester, the program offers to specialize through the electives and undergo hands-on training through the laboratory courses. In the third and the fourth semesters, the students would take up a research project along with exploring and specializing their knowledge base by taking one elective of their choice from any department in each semester.

Overall, the proposed curriculum <u>M Tech in Biomedical Science and Engineering with Specialisation in Medical</u> <u>Devices and Diagnostics</u>, is to be started from July 2022. Further, addition of specializations such as regenerative medicines, bioinformatics, and health data science and analytics, to this curriculum is expected to happen in the years to come.

Eligibility Criteria:

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For the regular category:

 Bachelor of Engineering/Technology degree in Electronics Engineering/ Electrical Engineering/ Mechanical Engineering/ Biotechnology/ Biosciences and Bioengineering/ Biomedical engineering/ Chemical engineering/ Chemical Science and Technology. Additionally, the candidate should have studied Mathematics as a subject at the Bachelors' level. OR

Bachelor of Pharmacy Degree. Additionally, the candidate should have studied Mathematics as a subject at the Bachelors' level. OR

Master of Science Degree in Physics/Chemistry/ Life Sciences. Additionally, the candidate should have studied Mathematics as a subject at the Bachelors' level.

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 Minimum CPI of 6.0 in a 10-point scale or a minimum of 60% of total/aggregate marks in the Qualifying Degree. The minimum marks requirement is relaxed by lowering 0.5 in CPI or 5% in marks for SC/ST/PwD candidates.
 For Ministry of Education Fellowship (regular and full time):

• The candidate should have valid GATE score in the relevant discipline.

For all categories other than regular (part-time/project staff/sponsored etc.):

• The candidate would also need to appear in the interview.

Number of Seats: 20 (Total). Up to 10% of total seats can be offered to non-regular candidates (part-time/project staff/sponsored candidates).

Minutes of the Meeting held on 28-02-2022

Pursuant upon the resolution of the 107th BoG (<u>Flag A</u>), a committee was constituted for developing a suitable mechanism for collecting alumni fee vide notice No. IITG/ER/BoG/54/787 dated 24-02-2022. The committee met in the office room of the Dean, AER on 28-02-2022 at 11 AM.

The Committee made the following observations -

- The Committee observed that the BoG on 26-12-2015 passed a resolution to charge an amount of Rs.1500 from all final year students of IITG starting from the year 2016 as Alumni fee initially for a period of five years (Extract of the minutes of 83rd meeting of the BoG placed at <u>Flag B</u>).
- The Board in its 98th meeting held on 19-08-2019 resolved to collect Alumni fee as one-time fee at the time of admission with a provision that this fee is to be returned to the student, if, he/she discontinues or is terminated from the academic program (Extract of the minutes of the 98th meeting of the BoG is placed at <u>Flag C</u>).
- Meanwhile, the hon'ble Gauhati High Court in its Order dated 27-11-2019 in WP(C)6224/2019 disposed of the petition directing IITG to refund the Alumni fee Rs. 1500 to the petitioners and also stated that the order is confined only to the petitioners of the present case without deciding in the issue raised by the petitioners (Flag D).
- 4. In the meeting of the DD with Deans & Associate Deans of Academic affairs and Students' Affairs, and Chairman HAB held on 22-05-2021 at 11 am (Extract of the of the minutes placed at <u>Flag E</u>), it was decided not to collect the Alumni Fee from the new students joining in July, 2021. It was opined by the committee that AER office shall make an appropriate proposal in this regard for consideration of the Institute.

In light of the above facts, and that the difficulty in determining upfront the graduating semester of the students to collect the fee in their final year/semester, the committee opined to continue as per the resolution of the BoG (mentioned in point 2 above) and recommends that –

- One-time fee of Rs. 1500/- towards Alumni Fee may be collected at the time of admission from each student with a provision that this fee is to be returned to the student, if he/she discontinues or is terminated from the academic program.
- 2. The Institute may continue collecting this fee as a perpetual matter without any time frame until further decision in this regard. However, the AER Office may review the quantum of fee, based on the need, and propose the same to the Institute for approval.
- 3. The committee also recommends for collecting the Alumni Fee from the students admitted in the AY 2021-22, which was kept in abeyance, along with the fee of Monsoon Semester, 2022.

The Committee met on 03.02.2022 at 1.05 PM in the Conference Room of the Deputy Director. All the members were present in the meeting.

Late Binod Das joined IIT Guwahati 18.06.2008 as Junior Attendant and was subsequently promoted to the post of Attendant on 21.03.2016. Mr. Das expired on 27.07.2020. Subsequently Ms. Barnali Das, wife of Late Binod Das applied for compassionate appointment along with the prescribed format.

As a dependent family member, Ms. Barnali Das, wife of Late Binod Das is eligible for consideration of appointment on compassionate ground as per policy adopted by the Institute which was approved by the BOG in its 105th meeting held on 30.11.2020. Further as per the statement of Ms. Barnali Das, her husband (Late Binod Das) was the sole earner of the family and after his death, the family is facing financial hardship. Following are the details about Ms. Barnali Das and a depiction of her financial status.

The Committee noted the following are the eligibility criteria and relaxation as per the policy adopted by the Institute which was approved by the BOG in its 105th meeting held on 30.11.2020.

Criteria & Relaxation

i) Appointment can be made Group 'C' (Entry Level) posts against the direct recruitment quota.

ii) The family is indigent and deserves immediate assistance for relief from financial destitution.

iii) Applicant for compassionate appointment should be eligible and suitable for the post in all respects under the provisions of the relevant Recruitment Rules.

iv) Compassionate appointments can be made up to a maximum of 5% of vacancies falling under direct recruitment quota in Group 'C' (including technical posts) that have arisen in the year. A person selected for appointment on compassionate grounds should be adjusted in the recruitment roster against the appropriate category viz. SC/ST/ OBC/General depending upon the category to which he/she belongs.

However, upper age limit can be relaxed wherever found to be necessary. The lower age limit should, however, in no case be relaxed below 18 years of age. Age eligibility shall be determined with reference to the date of application and not the date of appointment.

The Committee noted that presently the Institute has 54 nos. of vacant post of group C category for direct recruitment. 5% of 54 post will be $2.7 \cong 3$ posts. At present Ms. Barnali Das is the only applicant under compassionate ground.

The Committee examined the application and other documents submitted by Ms. Barnali Das and found that all the criteria have been fulfilled by Ms. Barnali Das. As far as age is concerned, the Committee decided to accept the relaxation clause.

The Committee also noted that the previous compassionate appointments in the Institute were made on contractual basis on consolidated pay for three years.

In view of this, the committee <u>RECOMMENDED</u> that Ms. Barnali Das may be offered contractual appointment on consolidated pay as Junior Attendant for immediate relief from financial destitution because of the loss of her husband.

Online Master's Degree Programme

Draft Guidelines for Online Master's Degree Programme

Preamble: Online Master's Degree Programme (OMP) of the Institute primarily targets working professionals and foreign nationals to do their MTech, the first research degree programme, so that the departments/centres, and in turn the Institute, shall be benefited in terms of research output and industry collaboration. However, departments/centres may also propose any other master's degree by demonstrating the benefits.

Degree and Discipline: The name of the degree and a contemporary title of the discipline shall be proposed along with supporting documents in comparison with such programmes at world class universities.

Strength of the Department/Centre: The department/centre shall submit a document covering its strength in the proposed discipline in terms of number faculty members and their teaching and research experience in the discipline. Further, the document should demonstrate the feasibility and sustainability of the programme and the benefit to the department/centre in terms of research output and any other. For each compulsory course, the department should identify at least two faculty members who can offer the course. For popular disciplines, depending on the enrolment, the department may offer the programme to multiple sections by maintaining an optimal number in each section.

Targeted People: The department/centre should specify the targeted students and the prospects of the programme. A survey report or an equivalent document in this regard shall be submitted.

Proposed Intake: The department/centre shall propose the initial intake and future plans in this regard. Feasibility document in terms of current work load of faculty and its projections to run the programme as serious as the regular programmes.

Execution Plan: The department/centre shall submit a suitable plan of teaching, mentoring and supervising the theses of the students covering all aspects in terms of number of hours of contact and number of faculty or teaching assistants or mentors involved for implementation. Further, a plan of conducting laboratories for each of the possible course with laboratory component in the proposed discipline. Assessment plan for each type of the courses of the discipline should be proposed.

Eligibility Criteria: Specify the criteria in terms of minimum educational qualification, national level eligibility test and work experience, etc. Provide appropriate justifications particularly if any criterion is different from the set criteria for respective programmes at IITG.

Selection and Admission Process: The departments/centres may conduct admissions twice in a year so that the students can join Winter/Monsoon semester and the programme will run during the regular semesters. Reservations as per the government of India rules will be followed.

Course Structure and Curriculum: The departments/centres shall propose the course structure and curriculum by considering the following parameters. Comparative study with similar programmes at world class universities shall be enclosed.

Credit Requirement: The credit requirement will be as per the Institute ordinances for the respective programmes. However, the programme duration is of minimum 2 years and a maximum of 5 years.

Contact Hours: To accommodate working professionals, the contact hours for classes will be scheduled during 8-10 AM and 6-8 PM.

Credit Structure and Mode of Teaching: Each course shall be designed as per the credit format of the Institute. The course instructor can either choose to deliver the lectures online in one of the following modes and formats.

- Live lectures: On an appropriate online platform, the course instructor will deliver live lectures. It should be ensured that the lectures are recorded and made available to students for reference and for compensating those students, if any, who may face technical issues during lectures. For a six-credit theory course, weekly three lectures will be held as per the schedule in a semester (of 14 weeks).
- 2. Pre-recorded videos: The course instructor will develop pre-recorded videos of one hour each and make them available to the students in advance, week wise. Further, the course instructor will conduct a weekly live session of at least one hour for discussion on the topics and for clarifications of doubts of the students. For a six-credit theory course, the course instructor will develop 30 pre-recorded videos of one hour each and will conduct four live sessions for every 10 pre-recorded video and each such session is of at least one hour. For courses of different credits, 10 pre-recorded videos + 4 live sessions can be considered as a unit for 2 credits.

Master's Thesis: After successful completion of compulsory courses prescribed for the programme, as per the topic of interest of the student, a faculty member of IITG will be assigned as a supervisor for guiding master's project which leads to a thesis. In addition, there can be a co-supervisor from industry. The project credits for MTech/MDes will spread over at least one year (two semesters) so that the student will get sufficient time to produce a thesis on the topic of research.

Certification and Degree: After completion of each course, a course completion certificate will be issued. A group of 3-4 courses can be designed as a module with appropriate name. After completion of a module, respective certificate will be issued. Similarly, after completion of the requirements for a degree, the degree will be awarded. The degree certificate will be exactly the same as that of regular degrees awarded by IITG, except that it will be clearly mentioned that the programme was held ONLINE.

MOOCS/GIAN: The credits earned through MOOCS/GIAN courses conducted by IITG will be counted if those courses are in the curriculum of the respective programme. For this, before taking up the MOOCS/GIAN course, the student will request the department with the details. The DPPC will review the proposal about the suitability and consult the faculty member(s) offering the MOOCS/GIAN course and accord approval, accordingly. In case of MOOCS course, the course instructor(s) shall conduct separate examinations for the students of OMP and award the grade. The department will decide the maximum number of MOOCS/GIAN courses permitted for the given programme.

Assessment: Each course will be graded by the respective course instructors in continuous assessment mode through quizzes, assignments, viva voce, etc., as deemed fit by the course instructors and one final examination of at least 50% weightage. All the examinations will be proctored examinations online or the

students will write the examinations at designated exam centres across the country. The final examination will be conducted on campus or at designated exam centres.

Registration Fee: A student admitted into respective programme has to register for at least one course in each semester for continuation in the programme. Registration fee for each course will be at the rate of Rs. 4000/- per credit for MSc/MA programme and it will be at the rate of Rs. 7,500/- per credit for MTech/MDes programme. For considering a course done through MOOCS/GIAN towards credit requirement of any of the programmes, the course registration fee will be 50% of the aforesaid full fee. A student has to pay about Rs. 7,50,000/- for MTech/MDes degree (assuming 100 credits) and Rs. 6,50,000/- for MA/MSc degree (assuming 160 credits).

Revenue Distribution: 50% of the revenue shall be with the Institute for development of infrastructure, maintenance and management. As per the existing model/administrative protocols of the Institute, the Institute shall arrange all the required infrastructure and manage it. For course execution, i.e. for course instructors, teaching assistants, mentors, etc., 30% of the revenue will reserved. Remaining 20% shall be allotted to DPF. The department/centre may arrange contingency and some minor equipment for course execution from its share.

For example, the revenue generated by MTech/MDes course of 6 credits for a class of 20 students will be distributed as follows:

Revenue Policy: The total registration fee collected for each course shall be considered as the fund of the "**Teaching Project**" against the respective instructor(s). There will be an upper limit on the remuneration paid to the course instructors (other than that is paid to TAs) for each course. The upper limit will be reviewed once in every three years. At present the limit is set as Rs. 2 Lakhs. Any amount more than Rs. 2 Lakhs allotted to course execution minus the remuneration paid to TAs, as per the actual enrolment of a particular semester, shall be credited to the PDF of the course instructors. For project courses, the Institute supervisor will get the amount allotted, but not the Industry supervisor, if any.

Programme Closure: A minimum number of student enrolment or the participation/availability of the faculty members should be made explicit for continuation of the programme. Failing this the programme will be closed.

Recommendations of the Committee constituted for various matters related to PhD programme

(Refer to the Annexure for the Committee Formation Notice and Terms of Reference)

I. AWARDING MASTER'S DEGREE FOR PHD STUDENTS ADMITTED WITH UG DEGREE

The Institute may make provision for awarding Master's + PhD dual degree for students admitted into PhD programme with the qualification BTech/BDes/BE/MBBS/BPharm/BVSc, etc. as per the following:

- 1. The departments/schools/centres may design curriculum for the course work of the students opting for Master's + PhD degree. The requirements for the course work will be a minimum 12 PG level courses with minimum aggregate of 72 credits spanning over three semesters. In each semester, there should be at least four courses with a minimum aggregate of 24 credits. The Master's degree shall be named amongst MTech/MDes/MS as deemed fit, depending on the disciplines of research. Depending on the disciplines/streams, a department/school/centre can make multiple proposals to the Senate, say, MS in Mathematics, MTech in Computing, etc. The maximum duration of the dual degree programme is seven years from the date of admission.
- The students admitted in the PhD programme will have an option to choose Master's + PhD dual degree only at the time of admission. Otherwise, they will be considered only for PhD degree. The option of dual degree will be available only to those students starting the coursework in July semester.
- The students opted for Master's + PhD degree shall do the course work as per the approved curriculum. Except the quantum of the course work, they should follow the existing rules of PhD Ordinance.
- 4. Awarding Master's degree only: This is not the objective of the proposal and hence this option is invoked only in the rarest of rare cases. After successful completion of the course work, comprehensive examination and SOAS by the student, should the DC feel that the progress of the student is not satisfactory at the time of first annual progress review, the DC may recommend for submission of Master's thesis suggesting the volume of work to be completed for the Master's degree. The student will submit Master's thesis and defend the same. The procedure for the submission of Master's thesis and conduct of oral examination are as per relevant Clauses of MTech/MDes/MS Ordinances. In that case, the student will receive only the Master's degree as per the enrolment.

II. ADMITTING TO PHD PROGRAMME UNDER REGULAR CATEGORY

In addition to the prescribed MEQ for the respective disciplines, the candidates (Indian nationals) must have one of the following listed qualifications for admission under the regular category for availing respective fellowships/assistantships:

A. For Institute Assistantship:

- 1. Valid GATE/CEED Score.
- BTech/BDes/MSc/MA/MTech/MDes/MS degree from an IIT with a minimum CPI of 8.0 on 10point scale.
- 3. UGC-CSIR-NET (Assistant Professorship) in case of Arts background candidates.
- 4. MTech/MDes or an equivalent degree (from any Institute) and having qualified GATE/CEED at some point of time (need not be valid at the time of admission).

B. For Fellowships from External Agencies:

- 1. NET JRF/SRF
 - a. CSIR
 - b. UGC
 - c. DST
 - d. DBT
 - e. ICMR
 - f. ICAR
- 2. NBHM Doctoral Scholarship
- 3. DAE Graduate Fellowships Scheme (DGFS)
- 4. UGC Rajiv Gandhi National Fellowship (UGC RGNF) Scholarship Scheme
- 5. PMRF

The candidates qualified for INSPIRE Fellowship shall be admitted in self-financed category only. As and when the fellowship is awarded, they will be converted to the regular category from the "Effective Date" of fellowship.

III. CATEGORY CONVERSION AND CHANGE OF FELLOWSHIP

- The students admitted under non-regular categories will not be permitted to convert to regular category for availing the Institute Assistantship at any point of time. However, if they qualify for the fellowship/assistantship of external agencies (refer II.B, above), they may be permitted to convert to regular category for availing the fellowship/assistantship from the external funding agency.
- 2. To ensure the eligibility for implementation of point (1) above, the admissions into non-regular categories should be done as per the following:
 - a. The shortlisting criteria for non-regular categories should not be lower than the criteria used for regular category candidates, except the criteria on the national level examinations.
 - b. The selection criteria should be the same for both regular and non-regular categories.
- 3. In addition to INSPIRE fellows, the admissions under self-financed category should be restricted to the accomplished working professionals only.
- 4. A student availing the Institute Assistantship shall be allowed to avail the fellowship/assistantship of external agencies. Among such students, only those who were allowed to avail any higher value fellowships for lesser duration (than five years) may be permitted to return back to avail the Institute Assistantship for the remaining period. Such return to the Institute Assistantship shall be permitted only once.
- 5. The students admitted under regular category with fellowship/assistantship from an external agency will not be allowed for conversion to the Institute Assistantship at any point of time.

IV. PERIOD OF ASSISTANTSHIP AND DEDUCTIONS

Period:

- The students admitted under regular category can avail the respective fellowship/assistantship, as per the norms of the respective funding agency. Currently, most of the funding agencies are awarding the fellowships for a maximum period of five years duration (from all sources) from the date of admission.
- 2. In case of Institute Assistantship, the period will be five years from the date of admission or the date of viva-voce, whichever is earlier. Currently, there is no provision for registration to the semester after submission of the thesis. However, to avail the assistantship till viva-voce as per above, such students may be permitted for semester registration.

Payment and Deductions:

- 3. Student performance on "Academic and Research " as well as "Teaching Assistantship (TA)" has to be evaluated and accounted for continuation of Assistantship.
- 4. The concerned department/centre/school of the student provides performance on TA duties on monthly basis. If performance in TA duties is found to be not satisfactory, student will receive half of the Assistantship amount for the month.
- 5. Concerning the non-satisfactory performance on the grounds of academic and research, the following deductions of Assistantship are applicable:

- 6. In case a student is terminated on the academic grounds and reinstated subsequently, the Assistantship will be resumed only after successful completion/meeting the requirement.
- 7. In case the Assistantship is deducted due to unsatisfactory performance of SoAS or APR, the full Assistantship shall be resumed from the date of approval of subsequent satisfactory performance. However, if SoAS is not held with in three months or APR is not held within six months, or the subsequent performance is unsatisfactory, the Assistantship shall not be paid from the respective dates.
- As per the PhD Ordinance, if a student's performance is unsatisfactory in SOAS, the student has to deliver another SoAS within one month. However, it is suggested to revise this time frame to three months.
- The academic requirements (course work, comprehensive examination, SoAS, APR) are not held/completed within the stipulated timeframe given in the ordinances, the Assistantship shall not be paid from the respective dates.
- 10. In all cases, the students will not be paid back the assistantship deductions.

ANNEXURE-16

EXCERPT OF THE 160TH MINUTES OF THE SENATE HELD ON 10.03.2022

Item 7: To consider the report of the committee constituted for looking into various matters related to PhD Programme.

The Senate found that as per resolution R.153/16(b)/2021 of the Senate, the Chairman, Senate constituted a committee with the following members vide notice no. IITG/Acad/Senate/2021 dated 14.06.2021 (Annexure 160/7A, Page No. 16) to study the matter of awarding Master's degree to the students admitted in PhD programme with undergraduate degree and the matters related to assistantship to the PhD students and submit its recommendations to the Senate:

Accordingly, the committee submitted a report containing its recommendations as placed at **Annexure 160/7B (Page No. 17-21).** The Senate noted that the committee's recommendations had been circulated among all faculty members for feedback. The feedback received is placed at **Annexure 160/7C (Page No. 22-23).** Prof. K. V. Krishna, ADoAA (PG), made a presentation on the report of the committee to the Senate highlighting the following:

- Master's Degree: The departments/schools/centres may propose curriculum for the course work with at least 12 PG level courses and a minimum aggregate of 72 credits over three semesters for Ph.D students (starting the courses work in July session) with undergraduate degree to earn Master's degree in M.Tech/M.Des/M.S depending on the discipline of research. The committee recommended modalities were aligned to the Dual Degree Ordinances of the Institute.
- 2. Regular Category Admission: The committee recommended an exhaustive list of eligibility requirements for admitting Ph.D students in Regular category with Institute Assistantship and also separately for Assistantship from External Funding Agencies funded by the Government. Further, the committee recommended that the candidates qualified for INSPIRE Fellowship would be admitted in Self-Financed category and would be converted to the Regular category upon award of the fellowship.
- 3. No Change to Institute Assistantship: The committee recommended that any student who was not availing the Institute Assistantship at the time of admission, whatsoever might be the reason, would not be permitted to change to Institute Assistantship. Such student may avail the Assistantship from external funding agencies. To ensure the eligibility for conversion, it was further recommended that the shortlisting/selection criteria for non-regular categories would not be lower than those of regular category and the self-financed category would be restricted to accomplished working professionals only.
- 4. Period of Assistantship: While the norms of availing Assistantship shall be as per the respective funding agency, it was recommended that the period of Institute Assistantship would be five years from the date of admission or up to the date of viva-voce, whichever was earlier. Currently, there is no provision in the Ordinance for registration to the semester after submission of the thesis. However, to avail the Assistantship till the date of viva-voce, the committee recommended that only such students might be permitted for semester registration.

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- Payment of Assistantship shall be based on the student's performance in academics and research, as well as the TA duties assigned. If the performance in the TA duties is not satisfactory, 50% deduction in the Assistantship will be applicable.
- 6. If the academic requirements (course work, comprehensive examination, SoAS, APR) are not held/completed satisfactorily within the stipulated timeframe given in the ordinances, the Assistantship shall not be paid from the respective dates. In case the SoAS/APR is unsatisfactory, at least 50% deduction in the Assistantship for 3 months/6 months is recommended.
- Timeframe for Repetition of SoAS: As per the PhD Ordinance, if a student's performance is unsatisfactory in SOAS, the student has to deliver another SoAS within one month. However, it was recommended to revise this timeframe to three months.
- 8. Assistantship during Coursework: It is noted that the CPI requirement for the coursework is 6.5 for PhD and Dual Degree in EEE, and it is 6 in case of Dual Degree in CSE. The committee recommended for 0.5 relaxation for continuation in the Dual Degree programme till the end of the stipulated period prescribed in the Ordinances. However, the committee recommended 50% deduction in the Assistantship if a student secures CPI between 6.0 6.5 in case of PhD and Dual Degree in EEE, and CPI between 5.5 6.0 in case of Dual Degree in CSE.
- 9. The committee recommended 100% deduction in the Assistantship where the matters correspond to the termination from the programme. In case a student is terminated on the academic grounds and reinstated subsequently, the Assistantship will be resumed only after successful completion/meeting the requirement. In all cases, the students will not be paid back the assistantship deductions.

Considering the recommendations of the committee and the feedback received thereof, the Senate deliberated the matter at length. The Senate appreciated the positive recommendations made by the committee to help the students and to maintain the quality at the same time. Particularly, the Senate noted that, currently, if the student performance in TA duties/SoAS/APR was unsatisfactory, the Assistantship was completely stopped. However, by distinguishing TA duties and academic performance, the committee recommended for partial payment of Assistantship.

The Senate observed the prevailing norms or the rules as per Ordinances vis-à-vis the committee's recommendations in above mentioned points, viz., 3. No Change to Institute Assistantship, 4. Period of Assistantship, 7. Timeframe for Repetition of SoAS, and the relaxation of 0.5 CPI for Dual Degree students during their coursework (as mentioned in 8 above), and accepted them for amendments to the respective Ordinances.

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Approving the report of the committee as a whole, upon due deliberation, the Senate opined the following:

- i. Maintaining a minimum of 72 credits for coursework, the departments/schools/centres may propose the number of courses for the proposed Master's Degree in (1) above. Further, the flexibility of offering the Dual Degree coursework for the students admitted in December session is left to departments/schools/centres, while submitting the proposal.
- ii. Admission to self-financed category shall not be for fresh graduates but for those who would like to join PhD after gaining certain experience in a profession. However, accomplishments of such professionals need to be quantified.
- iii. For Fellowships/Assistantships available from any other Government agencies to support PhD students on regular basis, such fellowships will be included in the list of external agencies.

The Senate further noted that there was no provision to avail regular Assistantships from two funding agencies as a top-up of the other. Accordingly, the Senate approved the matter and recommended to place to the BoG for consideration.

<u>R.160/7/2022</u>: The Senate **RESOLVED** that the report of the committee constituted for looking into various matters related to PhD Programme be **APPROVED** and **RECOMMENDED** to be placed to the BOG.

NOTICE INVITING APPLICATION FOR EMPANELMENT OF LAW FIRM OR A GROUP OF ADVOCATES

Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati, incorporated under the Indian Institute of Technology (Amendment) Act, 1994 (35 of 1994) is an autonomous body under Ministry of HRD. Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati is a premier institute of higher education which was established in 1994 in Guwahati. It is governed by the Institutes of Technology Act, 1961 which have declared IITs as institutions of national importance and lays down their powers, duties, and framework for governance etc. The Institutes of Technology Act, 1961 lists twenty-three institutes (after the last amendment in 2016).

Applications are invited from eligible Law Firms / Groups of Advocates for empanelment to represent IIT Guwahati before different Courts of Law and provide legal advices in administrative matters.

GUIDELINES FOR EMPANELMENT OF LAW FIRM OR A GROUP OF ADVOCATES

Before filling the application form given in **ANNEXURE-I**, the Law Firms / Groups of Advocates are advised to carefully read and follow the eligibility criteria, instructions and terms & conditions for empanelment of Advocates in IIT Guwahati as mentioned herein below:

Eligibility of Empanelment

a) Bachelor degree in Law from a recognized University and registration with Bar Council of India for all the advocates associated with a Law Firm or a Group.

- b) There should be minimum three associate advocates in case a Law Firm and similarly in case of the Group of advocates
- c) Senior Advocate of the Law Firm or the senior Advocate from the Group of Advocates should have a minimum, relevant experience of fifteen years of handling civil/criminal/service/IPR/land related matters/quasi-judicial forums like consumer forums, arbitral tribunals etc.
- d) All the advocates associated with a Law Firm or a Group should have good communication/drafting skills in English and good knowledge of law and procedure, in civil and criminal matters.
- e) The Law Firms / Groups of Advocates should be familiar with various branches of law especially those concerning laws of matters related to various writs, PIL, Land Disputes/Constitutional/ Service Law/Contract Law/ Property Laws and Taxations/IPR/consumer forum etc.
- f) Preference will be given to Law Firms / Groups of Advocates who have dealt earlier with Government Funded Educational Institutes / Government Funded Higher Education Institutes / Universities / Government Department cases (writ petitions / appeals) in Hon'ble Supreme Court / Hon'ble High Court and Hon'ble District Courts.
- g) The Law Firms / Groups of Advocates should be well conversant with Prevention of Corruption Act, Central Vigilance Commission Act, Indian Penal Code, RTI Act etc. and Procedural Codes.

Tenure of Empanelment:-

The initial empanelment will be for **one year**. Performance of empanelled of Law Firm / Group of Advocates shall be reviewed periodically or on annual basis. However, on completion of the term and satisfactory performance, the empanelment may be extended from year to year. IIT Guwahati reserves the right to terminate the empanelment at any time without assigning any reason thereof.

Payment of Fee and Other Conditions:

a) The fees payable to the empanelled Law Firm / Group of Advocates are as per approved fee structure of IIT Guwahati which is given as **Annexure - II**.

b) No retaing fee shall be paid to any Law Firm / Group of Advocates merely because such Advocate has been empanelled.

Procedure for Empanelment:

The empanelment of the Law Firm / Group of Advocates will only be based on merit. For this purpose, the applications received shall be scrutinized by IIT Guwahati. The final selection will be made based on interview/interaction or any other criteria as fixed/deem fit by the Authority of the Institute.

Duties/ General instruction to the Empanelled Law Firm / Group of Advocates:

- a) The Law Firm / Group of Advocates will have to represent IIT Guwahati before the Court in the assigned cases.
- b) Law Firm / Group of Advocates shall visit the Institute at least twice a week, preferably spend 4 to 6 hours. In case of any emergency/ urgent work, the Law Firm / Group of Advocates shall have to visit on Saturdays / Sundays.
- c) Law Firm / Group of Advocates shall not advise any party or accept any case against IIT Guwahati during the period of empanelment.
- d) Timely appearance of the Law Firm / Group of Advocates to contest the cases for IIT Guwahati in the court is a must. Absence in the Court, without any reasonable ground and notice in advance, will not be accepted.
- e) Law Firm / Group of Advocates should handle the cases, which are assigned to them, and appear in such assigned cases in the Courts and should prepare Written Statement, Application, Reply Affidavit etc. as and when required.
- f) IIT Guwahati shall send the information through email regarding assignment of a case and after receiving the e-mail, it is the duty of the Law Firm / Group of Advocates to collect the brief/copy of petition along with assignment letter from the concerned office of IIT Guwahati at the earliest.
- g) Law Firm / Group of Advocates should be able to provide legal opinion to IIT Guwahati, and should also be able to prepare Reply to the Legal notices of the applicants on behalf of IIT Guwahati whenever asked for.

- h) IIT Guwahati is free to engage any advocate of its own choice and the empanelled Law Firm / Group of Advocates shall make no claim that it alone should be entrusted with IIT Guwahati's legal matter (s).
- i) Refusal by the Law Firm / Group of Advocates to accept any work without any reasonable cause (e.g. on grounds of conflict of interest) may entail its removal, forthwith without waiting for the empanelment period to expire.
- j) In order to ensure that there is effective check on the cases being conducted, the Law Firm / Group of Advocates on the panel must report the status of the cases after each date of hearing. Failure to submit status report will be a ground for removal of the Law Firm / Group of Advocates from the panel or non-payment of the charges.
- k) In cases where on the request of the Union of India and Ministry of Human Resource Development have also to be represented, no extra fee shall be paid to watch and safe guard the interests of Union of India and Ministry of Human Resource Development.
- Keep IIT Guwahati informed and updated on all-important developments in the designated cases, dates of hearing, order of the court on the date of its pronouncement, supplying copy of orders /judgment etc.
- m) Furnish monthly statement about the cases as represented before the concerned courts or any other authority and their outcomes.
- n) When any case attended is decided against the Organisation, the Law Firm / Group of Advocates concerned must give considered opinion regarding the reasons for such adverse order and the advisability of filling an appeal from such a decision not later than 5 working days of the order.
- o) IIT Guwahati reserves the right to terminate the appointment/empanelment of Law Firm / Group of Advocates with one month's notice in writing without assigning any reason. The Law Firm / Group of Advocates may also resign from IIT Guwahati by serving one month's notice
- p) In the event of any doubt or difference of opinion regarding the terms and conditions of empanelment, the decision of IIT Guwahati shall be final and binding.

Documents required to be submitted by the Advocate:

The Law Firms / Groups of Advocates will be required to submit their Applications in the prescribed format as given in Annexure-I. The self-attested copies of the following documents are required to be submitted with application:

- a) High School certificate in support of age of Advocates from the Law Firm/ Group of Advocates
- b) Certificates in support of educational qualifications of Advocates from the Law Firm/ Group of Advocates
- c) Certificate of Registration with Bar Council for all the Advocates from Law Firm / Group of Advocates.
- d) Documents regarding empanelment with other Organizations, if any.
- e) Details of representing other Govt. / PSU / Statutory Bodies/Universities etc. in courts/forums/tribunals etc., if any.
- f) Details regarding the cases in which the Law Firm / Group of Advocates was able to get favorable outcome/decision which are reported/referred in reputed legal journals etc.
- g) Details of office(s) Infrastructure and number of Associates in addition to office staff.
- h) Other relevant information, if any.

The Committee, having of the following members, met through online at 3.30 p.m. on 25.12.2021.

Professor Sitharam welcomed the members and briefed the Establishment of School of Business. Professor Punniyamurthy presented the follow up of the suggestions of the 1st meeting dated June 26, 2021. The progress of the suggestions 1-3 and 5 was noted.

The consideration of the involvement of foreign faculties for 1 or 2 semesters was discussed. Professor Purkait briefed the involvement of 70 foreign faculties (Honorary / Visiting / Adjunct Professors) in regular academic activities and agreed to prepare proposal with FA for the consideration of foreign faculties in teaching for 1 or 2 semesters.

Professor Purkait also mentioned that the pandemic has led some of the present faculties to become less productive, which will be reflected in the future and suggested to bring a mechanism to motivate them to pursue research and take up more project activities. It was decided that a suitable review and support mechanism can be worked by Director to address these issues.

The committee was then briefed the status report of the filling up of backlog vacancy positions and the implementation of roaster with regular recruitment. The advertisement for the special drive was also briefed whose deadline is January 15, 2022. Dr Rao suggested to arrive at alternates in case these reserve posts continue to remain vacant for extended times.

Professor Bapat highlighted the importance of interdisciplinary research and suggested to explore of having of a minimum number of permanent faculty in Centre of Indian Knowledge Systems. The committee agreed to explore the possibilities.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the chair.
