Additional /Joint Secretary (TE) MoE, and Commissioner & Secretary to the Government of Assam, Higher Education, could not attend the meeting due to their prior engagements and they were granted leave of absence.

Before start of the Meeting, Chairman welcomes the new member of BOG, Prof. Bijoy Kumar Upadhyaya, representative from the state of Tripura.

After the welcome address, the Director briefed the members about the recent protest by the students following the event of death of a student in the Institute. Director reported that many students gathered to protest against the administration when a third-year BTech Computer Science Engineering student of the Institute was found dead inside his hostel room on September 9, 2024, morning.

Director informed that a number of steps have been taken, for taking care of the wellbeing of the students. Steps are being taken to provide extended counselling support to the students, enabling students to meet with counsellors after class hours if needed. To ensure easy access to mental health resources, QR codes are displayed on hostel room doors, connecting students directly to support contacts.

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Director also informed that the attendance rule needs to be raised and the Senate will deliberate on this

considering the overall wellbeing of the Students.

Further Director proposed creating an additional position of Dean of Academic Research to look after all the

Research students of the Institutes as it is becoming gradually impossible for a single Dean of Academic Affairs

to look after all category of students as with the growth of the Institute the student strength is also increasing day

by day. Dean Academic Research will look after Institute Post-Doctoral Fellowships (IPDF) and Research

Assistantships (RA) also.

Director also informed that, in the 98th meeting of Board vide resolution R98BOG/23/2019 approved the proposal

of inclusion of Deputy Director as a Special Invitee to all the meetings of BOG of IITG. In the similar line as the

Institute do not have any Deputy Director, it was proposed by the Director to include Dean Administration as a

special invitee to all the meetings of the Finance Committee and BOG of the Institute.

After the brief of the Director, the agenda of the day were taken up.

4. Grievance/Petition to National Commission for Schedule Tribes against IIT Guwahati by Dr. Chaitali Brahma, Registrar CIT Kokrajhar

A sitting notice has been received by the Institute from National Commission for Schedule Tribes (NCST) on the basis of a complaint received from Dr. Chaitali Brahma, Registrar CIT Kokrajhar whose offer to the post of Registrar, IIT Guwahati was cancelled as she failed to join the post of Registrar within the stipulated extended time of 17.05.2024 (w.e.f) end of the working hours of 17th May 2024) as per decision of BOG (by Circulation).

The commission decided to investigate the matter and sitting was fixed for investigation/inquiry/action to be taken in the matter on 03.10.2024 at 12.30 PM in the Court Room NCST, New Delhi. Accordingly, Registrar in charge of the Institute with due permission from Hon'ble Member NCST attended the sitting on behalf of Director.

After discussion, the Commission recommends the following and suggested to submit the Action Taken Report within 30 days-

- i. IIT Guwahati may initiate the process to postpone the recruitment process for the post of Registrar scheduled for 04.10.2024 for Two (2) months.
- IIT Guwahati may revoke the letter cancelling offer of appointment to the petitioner as the post of Registrar
- iii. Director, CIT-Kokrajhar, may initiate the process for relieving petitioner, so that she can join the post of Registrar at IIT Guwahati.

In view of the above, IIT Guwahati postponed the interview for the post of Registrar for which advertisement was issued vide advt. No IITG/R/05/2026 dated 01.07.2024 scheduled on 04.10.2024.

The Board was requested to **NOTE** and **ACCEPT** or put forward any advice/suggestion on the above-mentioned items as reported.

The Board **NOTED** the items mentioned at Sl. 1, 2 and 3. Further, the Board discussed about (i), (ii) and (iii) of Sl. 4 in details.

In this regard, the Board deliberated that, the decision to cancel the appointment of Dr Chaitali Brahma to the post of Registrar is taken unanimously by the Board, after providing her enough opportunity to join the post of Registrar by giving her a number of extensions. At last as per her request she was given a final extension of joining time by 17.05.2024 (end of the working hours). She was also clearly intimated that no more request for extension will be entertained if she fails to join by 17.05.2024, so **NOTING** the recommendation of the National Commission for Schedule Tribes on appointment of Dr Brahma, the Board decided to **UPHOLD** the decision of the Board regarding cancellation of the appointment of Dr Brahma. Further Board deliberated that, Institute like IIT Guwahati cannot run without a permanent Registrar and already nearly 2 years had passed without a permanent Registrar, so it DIRECTED the Institute to constitute a selection committee immediately and complete the entire procedure of recruitment of Registrar advertised vide advt. No IITG/R/05/2026 dated 01.07.2024 within a month with the applicants already shortlisted for the said advertisement where interview was scheduled on 04.10.2024,

Further, during this discussion, Chairman suggested that the Registrar in charge is having an extended duration because of the delay in conducting the interview. Therefore, it is time to replace the Registrar in Charge so that the process of conducting the interview is pursued with renewed energy.

To Consider and revise the functions of the Audit Section

It was apprised to the Board that; the function of the audit section was approved in the 60th meeting of the Board dated 16.03.2010. Of the various functions approved in the 60th BOG meeting, it was proposed to revise the following modifications in the function of the Audit Section under point no. 1, 2 and 5, keeping the rest same:

- 1. All recommendations for purchase of non-consumables above rupees five (5) lakhs and of consumables above rupees one (1) lakh **may be revised to** all recommendations for purchase of non-consumables above rupees ten (10) lakhs and of consumables above rupees three (3) lakhs.
- 2. All bills for purchase orders of total bill value above rupees five (5) lakhs for non-consumables and above rupees one (1) lakh for consumables **may be revised to** all bills for purchase orders of total bill value above rupees five (5) lakhs for non-consumables and above rupees two (2) lakhs for consumables.

The matter was also placed in the 56th meeting of the Finance Committee which was tabled on the day of the meeting.

The Board was requested to consider and revise the functions of the Audit Section as per recommendation of the Finance Committee.

Item No 17

To consider escalation in purchase of the Equipment "200 KV High Resolution Field Emission **Transmission Electron Microscope**"

The Board was apprised that, against Institute NIQ No. IITG/SNP/EP-R/CIF-340/2023-24 dated 05.01.2024, a single Bid from M/s Jeol India Pvt. Ltd. was received in relation to purchase of "200 KV high-resolution field emission transmission electron microscope". After necessary verification, price bid was opened and price of ₹12,22,18,500.00 quoted by the vendor was 52.77% more the indented value. As per the circular dated 20.07.2017 under Ref: IITG/S&P/Rules/2017-18/1157, limit of escalation over indented value for all equipment and furniture purchase is fixed at 20%. The guoted price being more than 20%, the purchase committee has gone for price negotiation after getting permission from the competent authority. As per the guotation received from the vendor dated 21.03.2024, the price was reduced to ₹10,87,00,451.00, which is also 35.8% more than the indented value and beyond the permissible value of 20%. The Head, CIF provided a justification as given in Annexure-18 (pg.122-123) for the purchase proposal in spite of the cost escalation beyond 20%. As such, for a decision, the matter was placed in the 120th meeting of BoG.

Simultaneously, further negotiation was done with the vendor and price had been reduced to ₹9,59,23,046.00 (which was within the permissible limit of 20%) as per their revised quotation dated 09.09.2024. However, as per

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the note sheet received from HoC, CIF, discrepancies were found in the new quotation in technical specification

which was not acceptable. Upon enquiry with the vendor, the vendor informed that if the technical specification is

to remain same, the price would be at the higher rate, i.e. ₹10,87,00,451.00 as quoted vide their quotation dated

21.03.2024 and accordingly, they have sent another quotation dated 25.09.2024, quoting the above referred price

with a validity period of 120 days. As mentioned before, this price is 35.8% above the indented price of

₹8,00,00,000.00 and as such it crossed the threshold limit of escalation as per the prevailing escalation norms

followed by the Institute. The matter is also placed before the 56th meeting of the Finance Committee which held

preceding this Board meeting for consideration of whether 35.85% escalation may be accepted as a special case

or otherwise, and recommend to the Board of Governors of the Institute accordingly.

The Board was apprised that, the Finance Committee deliberated on the matter and opined that the equipment

being a highly sophisticated one, which is extensively used for research purpose by the different stakeholders

within the Institute and researchers from the region, the committee advised that a fresh justification from the

Indenter about any additional cost to be included in the estimate considering the features/specifications during

preparation of budgetary estimate vis-a vis during the tendering process. It is also opined that the Director of the

Institute be authorized to take a final decision based on the report regarding the purchase of the equipment at the

quoted price of ₹10,87,00,451.00.

In view of the above, the Board was requested to consider escalation in purchase of the Equipment "200 KV

Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India & the Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati for 2024-25 in pursuance of the Rule 229(xi) of the GFR, 2017

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as MoU) is entered into at New Delhi on this____ day of _____, 2024 between Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Education, Government of India, Shastri Bhawan, Rajendra Prasad Road, New Delhi-110011 (hereinafter referred to as MoE)

And

The Indian Institute of Technology Guwahati (hereinafter referred to as the Institute) having its Headquarter at Guwahati and represented by its Director (hereinafter referred to as the Institute) which term and expression shall mean and include, unless repugnant to the context, its successors, assignees, administrators of the Institute.

WHEREAS

- This MoU is executed in terms of Rule 229 (xi) of the General Financial Rules, 2017 (hereinafter referred to as GFR, 2017) and the subsequent instructions issued by the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure, (hereinafter referred to as MoF) with the objective of improving efficiency of the expenditure, making the action plan outcome oriented, maintaining financial discipline and measuring performance of the Institution on key parameters against the targets set so as to improve its performance.
- The Institute has the pre-defined Vision, Mission and Objectives as outlined here under: -

A. Vision:

- To be recognised internationally for excellence in research, pursuit for development activities and deep concern for students' care
- ii) To be of service to the citizens of the Country
- iii) To become a preferred destination of:
 - Students seeking best science and engineering education
 - Scholars seeking intellectual ambiance and encouragement for research
 - Companies recruiting innovative minds
 - Organizations seeking collaboration in product development

iv) Values:

- · Academic excellence and freedom
- Fostering the spirit of inquiry, adventure and exploration both at problem solving and conceptual advancement
- · Continuous improvement of programs and processes
- · The success of students and develop their individuality
- · Personal and professional development of the faculty and staff
- · Diversity among the students, faculty and staff

v) Institutional Goals:

- To be recognised as one of the worlds' top 100 Institute/University in coming fifteen years
- To enhance external grant and research funding at the level of Internationally well ranked institutes
- To graduate 95% of the entering PhD students within four years while maintaining rigorous academic standards
- · To furnish state-of-art facilities for all programs in coming fifteen years

B. Mission:

- i. To act as a nucleus for the growth of science and technology
- To sustain and foster excellent education in engineering and science in undergraduate levels
- iii. To give a major boost to the existing post-graduate coaching/teaching and research programmes, initiate new research activities in selected disciplines and achieve excellence
- iv. To promote globalization and support for local industries hand in hand
- To promote technology transfer from Institute to Industries and academic institutions
- vi. To promote innovation in all field and provide support to innovators and entrepreneurs
- To promote sponsored research and collaborative projects with industries, R&D organization and academic institutions in India and Abroad
- viii. To contribute to the development of India and North East India in particular

C. Objectives:

- To provide the best educational infrastructure for imparting high class education in science and technology and a creative atmosphere for interdisciplinary research both by the students and the faculty
- To increase the student capacity to meet the growing demands for the country
- To maintain global standards in student-faculty ratio, research output, publications in journals and placement of students
- iv. To participate in and contribute to nation building
- To provide research and development consultancy, which will foster healthy industry-academia partnership, thereby providing a competitive edge to the indigenous manufacturing

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties here to express their common understanding as under:

(A) MOE shall

- (i) Provide financial support to the Institute to meet its recurring and nonrecurring liabilities in such manner and on such conditions as prescribed by the Government of India (hereinafter referred to as Gol) from time to time,
- (ii) Help raise other resources, including loan from HEFA for expansion of infrastructural facilities, which have a direct bearing on the performance of the Institute as committed in this MOU.
- (iii) Provide guidance and advice in administrative, financial, legal and such other matters as the Institute may require in fulfilling its mandate.
- (iv) Provide support in obtaining necessary clearances and approvals, as and when required, from various Ministries, Departments, and Agencies of the Central/State Governments.
- (v) Provide support in resolving any dispute with any other authority of the Central/State Government or a private party, as and when required.

(B) THE INSTITUTE shall comply with:

- (i) Without prejudice to what has been stipulated in the Institute of Technology Act, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the Act of 1961), as amended from time to time and the Statutes framed there under, the institute is expected to recover user charges at rates not lower than cost recovery norms
- (ii) Specific provisions as contained in the OM No.1/1/2016-E.IIIA dated 13.01.2017 in relation to revision of pay scales in accordance with the

- recommendations of the 7th CPC and any other instruction issued by MOE from time to time on issues pertaining to the Institute.
- (iii) The provisions of the GFR, 2017, including the instructions on financial advice for autonomous bodies, as mentioned in Rule 229(viii) and those concerning release of grants-in-aid, submission of audited accounts, performance report etc.
- (iv) Guidelines issued by the Central Vigilance Commission (CVC) in matters of vigilance and disciplinary proceedings etc.
- (v) Uniform accounting procedure in accordance with the guidelines issued by MoF.

Provisions of the Institutes of Technology Act, 1961, the Statutes framed thereunder and the instructions issued by MOE from time to time with regard, inter-alia, to creation of posts and framing of Recruitment Rules.

(C) THE INSTITUTE shall also ensure to:

- (i) Finalize any understanding or MoU with any other party including similar organizations abroad in accordance with the provisions of the Act of 1961 and the Statutes framed there under, and the instructions issued by MOE from time to time.
- (ii) Frame Rules for its corpus fund indicating clearly the Internal Revenue Generation(IRG) that can be transferred to such fund or utilized from such fund and items for which such expenditure can be incurred.
- (iii) Have clearly defined 'Delegation of Powers' for deciding all administrative and financial matters.
- (iv) Shall run courses, to the extent possible, to be self supporting without the need for cross subsidization as well as over-charging from students for flagship courses.
- (v) Ensure that the post of Registrar is filled up by a person having sufficient experience in administration and should preferably be an appropriate level official from the Government on deputation to ensure neutrality and transparency.
- (vi) Ensure that the Recruitment Rules for the posts of Registrar and the Finance Officer are framed and the selection must follow the Recruitment Rules.
- (vii) Ensure that all its accounts are audited by internal auditors regularly and formal audit by the C&AG in terms of the provisions of the Act of 1961 and the Statutes framed thereunder.

- (viii) Ensure that all financial operations are done under the EAT Module of PFMS and transaction done through TSA mode.
- (ix) Present an outcome budget along with annual action plan so that it can be dovetailed in the outcome budget of MOE.
- (x) Comply strictly with the timelines for submission of annual reports and annual audited accounts to MOE for the purpose of being tabled in Parliament within 9 months from close of the financial year.
- (xi) Forward to MOE any information required by it to satisfy any requirement related to Parliamentary Matter, RTI, Public Grievances, VIP References, Court Cases, and Notices from Commissions and Statutory Authorities and also inputs for formulation of any policy.
- (xii) In order to attract good number of meritorious students to join PMRF scheme, faculty members of the institute has identified 60 potential students in final year, for mentoring and guiding them in preparing projects / abstracts so that they are able to meet the PMRF selection criteria.
- (xiii) The Institute to ensure that the reservation in prescribed percentage is followed as per the CEI (Reservation in Admission) Act, 2006 for students and as per the CEIs (Reservation in Teachers Cadre) Act for faculties. Also, the GoI guidelines are followed in recruitment of non-teaching posts. The Institute shall ensure equal opportunities and necessary facilities to persons with disabilities in admission and services as per the law.
- (xiv) Special recruitment drive in mission mode will be conducted by the Institute to fill the vacant faculty positions. So far 14 number of faculties has been recruited by the Institute.
- (xv) It shall be the responsibility of (Institute acronym) to ensure that support of Ministry of Education is suitable incorporated in the publications (papers, reports etc.), products, technologies and the catalogues arising out of the PROJECT. This support should include all such PROJECTs where institute resources are being utilized (men and material both); where Scholarships/ fellowships are being used from this Ministry's fund (please mention specifically if PMRF fellows are involved); where salaries for faculty/ non-faculty involved in PROJECTs are being paid from Ministry's fund; all other projects where funds from Ministry of Education are being utilized directly or indirectly etc.

Sub: Audit Para entitled "Irregular Allowance of Increment to Newly Recruited Faculty Members Resulted in Overpayment at IIT Guwahati"

Ref: Your letter No. F. No. 32-28/2017-T.S. I dated 03.10.2022, our letter No. AD/101/BOG/98/99/Vol. IX/448 dated 13.03.2024 & DIR/IITG/05/MoE/2024 dated 28.06.2024.

Sir.

Please recall the meeting held on 02/07/2024 in the Office Chamber of the Director (IITs), Department of Higher Education. On the above subject matter of audit para, the Institute has to submit the following:

- 1. The Institute received a communication from the Ministry of Education (MoE) vide F. No. 32-28/2017-T.S. I dated 03.10.2022 (Enclosure 01) wherein it was requested to furnish comments/latest status regarding an irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members which resulted in overpayments. This communication of MoE also contains a DO No. OA(R)/DP/AB/IITs/Pay/2029-20/167 dated 15.09.2022 from the Director General of Audit (DGA), Central, Kolkata. Some of the important observations contained in the said DGA DO letter are reproduced below for ready reference:
 - (a) The subject matter of the draft paragraph is: "In violation of Fundamental Rules, the Indian Institutes of Technology at Kharagpur and Guwahati allowed irregular increment to newly appointed faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, resulting in overpayment of ₹2.78 crore (till March 2022)".
 - (b) Test-check of records relating to appointment of newly recruited faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, showed that both Institutes had allowed them to exercise option regarding date of fixation of their pay at the time of their appointment under FR 22(I)(a)(I), which is inadmissible in cases of direct recruitment. Consequently, the newly recruited faculty members opted to have their pay fixed from the date of accrual of the next increment in the time scale of the post previously held by them, either in the same institute, or elsewhere.



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However, permitting newly recruited faculty members to exercise this option, led to fixation of their pay at a higher stage in the time scale of the new post, from the date of next increment. In 54 such cases test checked in audit, permitting the exercise of this option, in violation of the Fundamental Rules, resulted in irregular fixation of pay, along with overpayment amounting to ₹2.78 crore (till March 2022). (Out of ₹2.78 crore, the overpayment to IIT Guwahati faculty members were ₹1.20 crores up to March 2022).

- (c) IIT Guwahati replied that it was aware of the provisions of pay fixation, as observed by Audit, and had followed the same till the implementation of 6th CPC. With the implementation of the recommendation of the 6th CPC, however, there had been anomalies in pay among faculty members, as the date of increment was uniform (1st July every year) for all employees. To remove these pay anomalies, the Board of Governors (BoGs), in its 63rd Meeting, had decided to give an option for fixation of pay from the date of the increment, to all faculty members appointed to a higher post after 01.01.2006.
- (d) The replies of both the Institutes are not tenable, as the provisions under FR 22(I)(a)(1), read with said DOPT's OM, provide that a Government servant, appointed on the basis of direct recruitment, shall not have the option to have his pay fixed from the date of accrual of next increment in the scale of the pay previously held by him. Thus, the methodology of allowing the option for fixation of pay from the date of the next increment, to the newly appointed faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, by these Institutes was irregular.
- 2. In the case of IIT Guwahati, the said DGA DO letter contained Annexure II listing names of 24 newly recruited faculty members appointed and joining during the period of January to June of the relevant years. It also mentioned the amount of overpayment against each one of them till March 2022. However, it is crucial to observe that the list did not include a single name of newly recruited faculty members appointed and joining during the period of July to December of the relevant years and attributing any overpayments made.
- Clause FR 22(I)(a)(1) of FRSR of Government of India as existed in 2010 is reproduced below:

F.R. 22 (I) The initial pay of a Government servant who is appointed to a post on a time-scale of pay is regulated as follows: -



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(a)(1) where a Government servant holding a post, other than a tenure post, in a substantive or temporary or officiating capacity is promoted or appointed in a substantive, temporary or officiating capacity, as the case may be, subject to fulfilment of the eligibility conditions as prescribed in the relevant Recruitment Rules, to another post carrying duties and responsibilities of greater importance than those attaching to the post held by him, his initial pay in the time-scale of the higher post shall be fixed at the stage next above the notional pay arrived at by increasing his pay in respect of the lower post held by him regularly by an increment at the stage at which such pay has accrued or rupees one hundred only, whichever is more.

Save in cases of appointment on deputation to an ex cadre post, or to a post on ad hoc basis or on direct recruitment basis, the Government servant shall have the option, to be exercised within one month from the date of promotion or appointment, as the case may be, to have the pay fixed under this rule from the date of such promotion or appointment or to have the pay fixed initially at the stage of the time-scale of the new post above the pay in the lower grade or post from which he is promoted on regular basis, which may be refixed in accordance with this rule on the date of accrual of next increment in the scale of the pay of the lower grade or post. In cases where an ad hoc promotion is followed by regular appointment without break, the option is admissible as from the date of initial appointment/promotion, to be exercised within one month from date of such regular appointment.

- 4. IIT Guwahati has been following rolling advertisements published on its website for faculty recruitment for the positions of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, and Professor for more than 2 decades. Whenever, a department/school/academic centre receives an adequate number of faculty applications from external as well as internal candidates, all the received applications are scrutinized/shortlisted category-wise as external candidates and internal candidates. All the shortlisted candidates (externals as well as internals) are then called to appear before a common selection committee on a fixed date and time of its meeting. The list of recommended candidates by the selection committee is placed before the Chairman, BoG for his approval and then all the selected candidates are issued appointment letters.
- 5. With the implementation of 6th Central Pay Commission recommendations effective 01/01/2006, the uniform date of increment in the salary was fixed as 1st July of every year. This fixed date of increment had introduced an anomaly in the pay fixation of newly recruited internal faculty members (internal candidates for short) of the Institute in the next higher positions appointed during January-June compared to appointments made during July-December of the same year. A typical case was of Prof. T Punniyamurthy, who had joined the position of Professor in March 2009 and his pay was fixed at a lower level compared to others who joined as Professor in August 2009, September 2009 and December 2009 as could be seen in the following table:

A perusal of statement of fixation of pay for Prof. T Punniyamurthy indicated that his pay in Pay Band 4 at the post of Associate Professor was ₹47660/- as on 13.03.2009. Upon his appointment by direct recruitment to the post of Professor on 14.03.2009, his new pay as in Pay Band 4 was fixed at ₹49380/- on 14.03.2009 by granting one increment in the previous post and his next date of increment was mentioned as 01.07.2010 as shown in Enclosure – 02. This pay fixation was strictly carried out as per FR 22(I) Part – A (at para 3 above).

However, in the case of others (viz., Drs S Barbora, Krishna Barua, Rajen Kr Sinha, Bhaba Kr Sarma, R Swaminathan, Pranab Goswami, Arun Goyal), all of them had earned one annual increment on 01.07.2009 on the previous post of Associate Professor, thereby having pay of ₹49380/- in Pay Band 4. Hence, upon their appointment by direct recruitment to the post of Professors during August 2009 to December 2009, their new pays were fixed at ₹51150/- in Pay Band 4 by strictly following FR 22(I) Part − A (at para 3 above). The statement of fixation of pay in respect of Prof. Bhaba Kr Sarma is available at Enclosure − 03 for ready reference.

The internal candidates appointed to the next higher positions during July-December of the relevant year had drawn higher pay in Pay Band as they earned one increment on 1st July in the previous position and one additional increment upon joining the new position. Whereas the internal candidates joining the new position during January-June had been granted only one increment for joining the new position while depriving them of their regular increment of the previous post (even after serving for more than 6 months in the previous post and scale). This anomaly was bound to continue till all of the internal candidates had reached the maximum of the pay scale/Pay Band of the respective post.

6. The procedure of pay fixation strictly following FR 22(I) Part - A (at para 3 above) appeared to be discriminatory for the internal candidates appointed during January-June compared to their counterparts appointed during July-December. This was pointed out as an "anomaly in pay fixation" to the Institute through representations by some of the affected internal candidates



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which was even discussed in Finance Committee (in its 24th meeting) and the minutes of the 24th meeting of FC were taken into consideration by BoG in its 60th meeting.

- 7. One of the internal candidates upon appointment to the next higher position of Professor on 07.05.2010 made a request to the Institute to fix his pay in the new position from the date of the next increment (DNI for short) of his previous position of Associate Professor. However, this request was turned down by the Institute (Enclosure 04) as pay fixation from the DNI was only applicable upon appointment on promotion as per FR 22(I) Part B (at para 3 above) but not by appointment on a direct recruitment basis. Hence, new pay was fixed from the date of joining the higher position of Professor with effect from date of joining the position i.e. 07.05.2010. This clearly established that the Institute was following the relevant rule i.e. FR 22(I) Part A as well as Part B (at para 3 above) even after implementation of 6th CPC recommendations.
- 8. A detailed representation on the anomaly in pay fixation was again received from an affected internal candidate, Prof. Mohammad Jawed only other internal candidate appointed to the post of Professor by direct recruitment during 2010. This representation was thoroughly examined by the administrative and internal audit sections of the Institute during August-September 2010. A portion of file-noting is reproduced below:

A careful perusal of the entire file-notings on this matter brings out the following inferences:

- (a) The procedure of pay fixation strictly following FR 22(I) Part A (at para 3 above) had introduced anomaly in pay for the internal candidates appointed during January-June (fixed pay in Pay Band at lower level) compared to their counterparts appointed during July-December of the same year (fixed pay in Pay Band at higher level).
- (b) FR 22(I) Part B (at para 3 above) was of no help as it was only applicable if the appointment was made by promotion, but not for appointments made on direct recruitment basis as with the case for faculty recruitment at IITs.
- (c) In fact, the Fundamental Rules and Supplementary Rules (FRSR) did not had any provision to handle the anomaly in pay fixation of an internal candidate of an organization who was appointed to next higher position by direct recruitment in the same organization (when the next increment was due in less than 6 months in the previous scale of pay/Pay Band).



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- (d) In the absence of any provision in FRSR to tide over this kind of anomaly in pay fixation, one option which could be thought of was if all the affected internal candidates appointed during January-June were allowed to change their date of joining to 1st of July, then this anomaly could had been taken care of.
- (e) Since, the affected internal candidates had already joined to the next higher positions prior to the date of next increment and had worked at the higher post carrying duties and responsibilities of greater importance than those attaching to the post held by them within and outside the Institute, the change in date of joining was likely to cause unseen issues later on and hence needed further consideration.
- (f) As a part of further consideration, it was essential not to go for change in date of joining the next higher position but at the same time, the anomaly in pay fixation had to be taken care of. This might be possible if the date of joining and date of pay fixation were delinked which meant that the affected internal candidates shall continue to draw the same pay in Pay Band as was in the previous post but allowed enhanced AGP of next higher position and the new pay in the Pay Band shall be fixed from the date of next increment.
- (g) The above proposition was thought of not in violation of FR 22 (I) Part A (at para 3 above) as new pay fixation in Pay Band was deferred till date of next increment. Also, this proposition was not in violation of FR 22(I) Part B (at para 3 above) as new pay fixation in the Pay Band was not carried out on the date of joining and then re-fixed on the date of next increment as the appointment was not made on promotion but on direct recruitment.
- (h) Hence, if the affected internal candidates gave their consent to get their pay fixation to higher position delayed till the date of next increment but just paid the enhanced AGP during intervening period, without making any change in date of joining to the higher position shall likely to resolve the anomaly in pay fixation. This proposition was found acceptable to the Institute.
- (i) In order to implement the proposition at (f), it was essential to seek option from the internal candidates who were already affected and likely to get affected in future for their pay fixation at the next higher position upon direct recruitment either from the date of joining of the next higher position or from the date of next increment without any change in pay in Pay Band of the previous position during the intervening period from date of joining to next higher position till the date of next increment in the previous post.
- The propositions at 8 (f) and (i) were considered in 63rd meeting of the BoG and upon its approval, the Institute sought options from the affected internal candidates for fixation of their pay in the Pay Band.



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10. Upon receiving the option, the pay fixation was revised as discussed in following paras for some of the affected internal candidates:

Prof. Seenipandian Ravi (DOJ: 20.03.2010) (S. No. 1 of Annexure-II of DGA DO letter:

Prof. Ravi opted to get his pay in Pay Band fixed from the date of his next increment (Enclosure − 05). The statement of re-fixation at Enclosure − 06 indicated that Prof. Ravi had drawn the pay of ₹49380/- in Pay Band 4 of the previous post of Associate Professor from 20.03.2010 till 30.06.20210. His new pay in Pay Band 4 was fixed at ₹52970/- on 01.07.2010 by granting one annual increment in the previous pay and another increment for appointment to the next higher position. Prof. Ravi had not drawn any financial benefit in respect of pay in Pay Band (excluding enhanced AGP) during the period 20.03.2010 to 30.06.2010.

Dr. A Rajesh (DOJ: 24.02.2014) (S. No. 5 of Annexure-II of DGA DO letter:

Dr. Rajesh also opted to get his pay in Pay Band fixed from the date of his next increment (Enclosure – 07). The statement of re-fixation at Enclosure – 08 indicated that Dr. Rajesh had drawn the pay of ₹40240/- in Pay Band 4 of the previous post of Assistant Professor from 24.02.2014 till 30.06.20214. His new pay in Pay Band 4 was fixed at ₹43250/- on 01.07.2014 by granting one annual increment in the previous pay and another increment for appointment to the next higher position. Dr. Rajesh had not drawn any financial benefit in respect of pay in Pay Band (excluding enhanced AGP) during the period 24.02.2014 to 30.06.2014.

Prof. Anugrah Singh (DOJ: 26.04.2014) (S. No. 6 of Annexure-II of DGA DO letter:

Prof. Singh also opted to get his pay in Pay Band fixed from the date of his next increment. The statement of re-fixation at Enclosure – 09 indicated that Prof. Singh had drawn the pay of ₹48150/- in Pay Band 4 of previous post of Associate Professor during 26.04.2014 to 30.06.20214. His new pay in Pay Band 4 was fixed at ₹51670/- on 01.07.2014 by granting one annual increment in the previous pay and another increment for appointment to the next higher position. Prof Ravi did not draw any financial benefit in respect of pay in Pay Band (excluding enhanced AGP) during the period 26.04.2014 to 30.06.2014.

Even anomaly in pay fixation of $Prof\ T$ Punniyamurthy was taken care of as could be seen from Enclosure-10.

 After implementation of 7th CPC from 01.01.2016 with introduction of two dates of increments, the issue of anomaly in pay fixation did not arise thereafter.

- 12. The anomaly in pay fixation had cropped up due to a fixed date of increment in a year, i.e. 1st July of every year as stipulated by 6th CPC and had automatically disappeared after implementation of 7th CPC with introduction of two dates of increments. Hence, this issue of anomaly in pay fixation shall be treated as a legacy issue of 6th CPC.
- 13. The submissions as made above have clearly vindicated the stand of the Institute as had been mentioned in DGA DO letter at para 1 (c) above.
- 14. It is again reiterated that the Institute had not committed any irregularities in pay fixation of internal candidates appointed during January-June as pointed out by audit para. Therefore, the Institute is not in agreement with the audit observation as this is not a case of excess payment at all. On the contrary, the affected internal candidates appointed on next higher positions by direct recruitment have been underpaid from the date of joining till the next date of increment, thereby causing no financial loss to the Institute.
- 15. As the Institute had not committed any irregularities/mistakes in pay fixation of internal candidates appointed during January-June which had not caused any financial loss to the Institute, therefore, the Institute would like to request the office of DGA to close this issue and drop the audit para in respect of IIT Guwahati so that the Institute could move on from hereafter.

Irregular allowance of increment to newly recruited faculty members resulted in overpayment of ₹ 2.78 crore

In violation of Fundamental Rules, the Indian Institutes of Technology, at Kharagpur and Guwahati allowed irregular increment to newly appointed faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, resulting in overpayment of ₹2.78 crors (till March 2022).

In terms of Clause 12(1) of the Statutes of the Indian Institutes of Technology (IT) at Khengpur and Guwanati, read with the instruction issued (August September 2009) by the Ministry of Education (eastwhile Ministry of Human Resource Development), both institutes invited applications for tilling up the post of faculty, through open advertisement, with both internal and external candisates being eligible for appointment to the past. Selection was to be suade through interviews and on the basis of the recommendations made by the Selection Committee. The Selection Committee was also to provide for protection of pay, if any, to such candidates.

Rule 22(I) (a) (1) of the Fundamental Rules (F.Rs.), dealing with the fixation of initial pay of a government servant, appointed to a post carrying duties and responsibilities of greater insportance than these attached to the post previously held by him, states that the initial pay fixation in the higher post is to he made after granting one increment in the time scale of post previously held by him. It further provides that the government servant shall have the

The provision to opt for the date of pay fixation is, however, not available to candidates appointed on the basis of direct recruitment.

Tost-check of records relating to appointment of newly recruited faculty members, selected on the basis of direct recruitment, showed that both Institutes had allowed them to exercise option regarding date of fixation of their pay at the time of their appointment under F.R. 22(I)(a)(1), which is inadmissible in cases of direct recruitment. Consequently, the newly recruited faculty members opted to have their pay fixed from the date of accrual of the next increment in the time scale of the post previously held by them, either in the same institute, or elsewhere. However, permitting newly recruited faculty members to exercise this option, led to fixation of their pay at a higher stage in the time scale of the new post, from the date of next increment. In 542 such cases test checked in audit, permitting the exercise of this option, in violation of the Pundamental Rules, resulted in irregular fixation of pay, slong with overpayment⁴ amounting to ₹2.78 crore⁹ (till March 2022) (Annexure).

HT, Kharagpur, replied that the pay fixation of the newly recruited faculty members had been curried out in terms of MHRD's Order! (October 2017), vide which candidates were allowed one notional increment in the existing academic level of pay previously held by them. It further stated that the pay

1.2 Institute Merit-cum-Means (McM) Scholarship

A. Institute Merit-cum-Means (McM) scholarship is awarded to non SC/ST students in B.Tech. / B.Des. / M.Sc. / M.A. of the institute strictly on merit-cum-means basis and on the recommendations of the scholarship committee.

B. Eligibility Criteria:

- i. Parents' income should not exceed the prescribed limit per annum, prescribed income limit for OBC (NCL) / EWS candidates (whichever is maximum) issued from time to time by GOI.
- ii. All 1st year B.Tech. / B.Des. / M.Sc. / M.A. students are eligible to apply. However, a CPI of 6.0 is mandatory for the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th year undergraduate and 2nd year M.Sc. / M.A. students. In case of a semester drop due to medical grounds, the semester drop will not be taken into account and he/she is eligible.
- iii. A maximum of 25% of the non SC/ST students in B.Tech. / B.Des. / M.Sc. / M.A. programmes are eligible for McM Scholarship as per the Statutes.
- iv. Students with any punishments/penalties imposed for academic malpractices and/or for disciplinary matters dealt with by SDC are not eligible.

C. Calculation of points based on which selection is made:

A maximum of 100 points may be awarded to the student based on parents' income and CPI. The break-up is as follows:

50 points

The scholarship shall have the following benefits:

- A fixed stipend per month for two semesters (August-November and January-April totaling 8 months) of Rs. 1000 per month.
- ii. Tuition fee waiver for two semesters.

F. Top-up Scholarships:

A student may be allowed to receive the McM scholarship with any other external scholarships (other than those scholarships that do not allow funding from multiple sources) provided that the total amount of the scholarship does not exceed 1.5 times the amount of the McM scholarship, subject to the condition below-

- a. If the external scholarship amount is greater than or equal to 1.5 times the McM scholarship, the student may avail of external scholarships only and no McM scholarship.
- b. If the external scholarship amount is less than 1.5 times the McM scholarship, the student may avail of the external scholarship plus an additional amount from the McM scholarship that does not make his total scholarship money more than 1.5 times the McM scholarship.

1.3 SC-ST Scholarships

A. SC-ST Scholarship is awarded to all B.Tech./ B.Des. / M.Sc. / M.A. SC-ST students on a means basis.

B. Eligibility Criteria:

- Parents' income should not exceed the prescribed limit per annum, prescribed income limit for SC/ST candidates (whichever is maximum) issued from time to time by GOI.
- ii. All B. Tech. / B.Des. / M.Sc. / M.A. students are eligible to apply.
- iii. Students with any punishments/penalties imposed for academic malpractices and/or for disciplinary matters dealt with by SDC are not eligible.

C. The period of the scholarship:

i. Eligible students will receive the scholarship for a period of two semesters:

August-November and January-April, covering 8 (eight) months in total.

ii. While all scholarships, including those for GEN and OBC students, will be governed by their respective norms and durations, any student other than GEN and OBC can avail of a scholarship from the Institute for a maximum of 6 years.

D. Benefits:

The scholarship shall have the following benefits:

- A fixed stipend per month for two semesters (August-November and January-April totaling 8 months) of Rs. 250 per month.
- ii. Free messing (only for the basic menu).
- iii. Exemption from hostel room rent.
- iv. Tuition fees are waived for all SC/ST students by the statute, irrespective of availing the SC-ST scholarship or not.

E. Top-up Scholarships:

A student may be allowed to receive an SC-ST scholarship with any other external scholarships (other than those scholarships that do not allow funding from multiple sources) provided that the total amount of the scholarship does not exceed 1.5 times the amount of the SC-ST scholarship, subject to the condition below-

- a. If the external scholarship amount is greater than or equal to 1.5 times the SC-ST scholarship, the student may avail of external scholarships only and no SC-ST scholarship.
- b. If the external scholarship amount is less than 1.5 times the SC-ST scholarship, the student may avail of the external scholarship plus an additional amount from the SC-ST scholarship that does not make his total scholarship money more than 1.5 times the SC-ST scholarship.
- For calculating the scholarship amount, the messing charges of the most recent month will be used.

The Senate RESOLVED that the draft ordinance for the Master of Business Administration programme be APPROVED in-principle. Further full document to be prepared and circulated among the members for RATIFICATION.

Item 9:

To consider the proposal for recommendations by DDC on academic malpractices during the examinations.

The Senate considered a proposal for delegating the disciplinary matters of academic malpractices during the examinations to the Departmental Disciplinary Committee (DDC). Further, considering the present trend, it was suggested in the proposal that the DDC may recommend Fall ("FD") grade to the student in the respective course wherever there is a material evidence. Currently, such matters are dealt by the Institute Academic Disciplinary Committee (IADC).

The Senate noted that the proposal is from IADC. Further, it was brought to the notice of the Senate that the students appearing to the enquiry of IADC often twist the matter to defend their act and, in such cases, IADC needs to contact the faculty invigilator before finalizing the recommendation. That is delaying the process of recommendations of IADC. Also, whenever there are appeals, there is a delay in processing the appeals, as the appeals against the penalties imposed based on the recommendations of IADC are to be placed to BoG.

The Senate deliberated the matter at length and opined that the proposal is acceptable. However, the Senate suggested that the report of the incident shall be prepared by two invigilators, at least one of them is a faculty member. Further, the report needs an endorsement of the course instructor. Accordingly, the Senate approved the updated proposal as placed at Annexure 170/9 (Page No. 26-i), and recommended to place the matter of delegation to the DDC to the BoG.

roposal for recommendations by DDC on academic malpractices during the examinations.

Preamble: As per the Ordinance on Code and Conduct of Students, disciplinary issues related to general conduct of students in the class rooms and laboratories shall be dealt with by the Departmental Disciplinary Committee (DDC) of the concerned Department, while students' malpractices in the examinations are dealt by the Institute Academic Disciplinary Committee (IADC) to maintain uniformity across the academic divisions. The concerned faculty invigilator makes a report at the first place and then IADC re-ascertains the matter to recommend the penalties. These days it is often observed that the students appearing in IADC twist the matter to defend their act and, in such cases, IADC needs to contact the faculty invigilator before finalizing the recommendation. That delays the process of recommendations. Also, whenever there are appeals from students, there is a delay in processing the appeals, as the appeals against the penalties imposed based on the recommendations of IADC are to be placed to the BoG.

Proposal: In order to bring ease in the process, it is now proposed that students' malpractices in the examinations may be dealt by DDC and recommend penalties. The Chairman, IADC shall give the approvals on these recommendations, as per the ordinance. The Chairman, IADC, may check the uniformity across the academic divisions before giving the approvals. In this process, the appeals, if any, can be placed to the Senate, as per the ordinance.

For effective implementation of the proposal, a format of the report shall be suggested by the Academic Affairs Section which will be prepared by two invigilators, at least one of them is a faculty member. The report shall be endorsed by the course instructor and submitted to the academic division which is offering the course. The DDC of the concerned division shall accordingly scrutinize the report (and enquire the matter, if necessary) to send its recommendations to the Chairman, IADC.

It is to be noted that considering the trend of malpractices in the examinations, IADC is recommending Fail ("FD") grade in the respective course, wherever there is a material evidence like electronic gadgets (mobile phone, smart watch, etc.), chits, exchanging sheets. Accordingly, it is also proposed that the DDC may recommend the penalty of Fail ("FD") grade to the student in the respective course, on those matters reported with material evidence. The Chairman, IADC, may accord approvals unless the student is a repeated offender or there is some non-uniformity across the academic divisions in the penalties recommended by DDC. If required, the matter may be placed to IADC. The approvals given by the Chairman, IADC on the academic malpractices shall be reported to the Senate.

Subject: Central Civil Services (Leave Travel Concession) Rules, 1988 - Relaxation to travel by air to visit North East Region, Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh and Andaman & Nicobar - extension beyond 25.09.2024 -regarding.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Department's OM No. 31011/15/2022-Estt.A-IV dated 11.10.2022 regarding relaxation to travel by air to visit North East Region, Jammu & Kashmir, Ladakh and Andaman & Nicobar, and to say that in relaxation to CCS (LTC) Rules, 1988, the scheme allowing Government servants to travel by air to North East Region (NER), Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir (J&K), Union Territory of Ladakh and Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar Islands (A&N) is extended for a further period of two years, w.e.f. 26th September, 2024 till 25th September, 2026.

- The above Special Dispensation Concession is subject to the following terms & conditions: -
- All eligible Government servants may avail LTC to visit any place in NER/A&N/J&K/Ladakh against the conversion of their one Home Town LTC in a four years' block period.
- ii. Government servants, whose Home Town and Headquarters/ place of posting are same, they are not allowed the conversion of any Home Town LTC as they are not eligible for the Home Town LTC facility.
- iii. The Government servant whose Home Town is situated in NER/A&N/J&K/Ladakh will also be allowed conversion of Home Town LTC for availing this Scheme to visit any place in any one of the three regions out of the above mentioned four regions except the region wherein his/her Hometown is situated.
- iv. Fresh Recruits are also allowed conversion of one of the three Home Town LTCs in a block of four years, applicable to them to visit NER/A&N/J&K/Ladakh. In addition, they are allowed one additional conversion of Home Town LTC to visit UT of J&K/UT of Ladakh in a block of four years.

- v. Government servants entitled to travel by air may avail this concession from their Headquarters in their entitled class of air by any airlines subject to the terms and conditions as enumerated in DoPT's OM. No. 31011/12/2022-Estt.A-IV dated 29.08.2022 read with DoPT's OM No. 31011/11/2023 Pers. Policy A-IV dated 20.10.2023 (copies enclosed).
- vi. Government servants not entitled to travel by air are allowed to travel by air in Economy class by any airlines subject to the terms and conditions as enumerated in DoPT's OM dated 29.08.2022 read with DoPT's OM No. 31011/11/2023 Pers. Policy A-IV dated 20.10.2023 in the following sectors:
 - a. Between Kolkata/Guwahati and any place in NER.
 - b.Between Kolkata/Chennai/Visakhapatnam and Port Blair.
 - c.Between Delhi/Amritsar and any place in J&K/Ladakh.

Journey for these non-entitled employees from their Headquarters upto Kolkata/Guwahati/Chennai/Visakhapatnam/Delhi/Amritsar shall be undertaken as per their entitlement.

- vii. Air travel by Government employees to NER, J&K, Ladakh and A&N as mentioned in para (v) and (vi) above is allowed whether they avail the concession against Anywhere in India LTC or in lieu of the Home Town LTC, as permitted.
- viii. Government servants not entitled to travel by air are also allowed to travel by air in Economy class by any airlines to any place in NER/A&N/J&K/Ladakh from their Headquarters directly, however, the reimbursement will be subject to the conditions as enumerated in DoPT's OM No. 31011/12/2022-Estt.A-IV dated 29.08.2022.
- ix. The instructions regarding booking of air tickets through authorized travel agents, best available fares, slots, booking time, advances, reimbursement, etc., as mentioned in DoPT's OM No. 31011/12/2022- Estt.A-IV dated 29.08.2022 read with DoPT's OM No. 31011/11/2023 Pers. Policy A-IV dated 20.10.2023 will also be applicable for this Special Dispensation Scheme.
- 3. All the Ministries/Departments are advised to bring it to the notice of all their employees that any misuse of LTC will be viewed seriously and the employees will be liable for appropriate action under the rules. In order to keep a check on any kind of misuse of LTC, Ministries/Departments are advised to randomly get some of the air tickets submitted by the officials verified from the airlines concerned with regard to the actual cost of air travel vis-a-vis the cost indicated on the air tickets submitted by the officials.

Subject: Instructions on booking of Air Tickets on Government Account in respect of Leave Travel Concession (LTC) - regarding.

The undersigned is directed to refer to the above mentioned subject and to state that in view of the disinvestment of Air India and the consolidated instructions issued consequently by Department of Expenditure vide O.M. No. 19024/03/2021-E.IV dated 16.06.2022, which is also applicable in case of air journey in respect of LTC, it has been decided that:

- In all cases of air travel in respect of LTC, air tickets shall be purchased only from the three Authorized Travel Agents (ATAs), namely:
 - (a) M/s Balmer Lawrie & Company Limited (BLCL),
 - (b) M/s Ashok Travels & Tours (ATT),
 - (c) Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation Ltd. (IRCTC).
- ii. The choice of the travel agent for booking of ticket from the three authorized travel agents is left open to the Ministry/Department and the official in case of self booking, based on convenience and service quality. No agency charges/convenience fees will be paid to these ATAs.
- iii. Government employees are to choose flight having the Best Available Fare on their entitled travel class which is the Cheapest Fare available, preferably for Non-stop flight in a given slot, mentioned below, at the time of booking. They are to retain the print-out of the concerned webpage of the ATAs having flight and fare details for the purpose of the settlement of the LTC claims.
 - (a) On the day of travel in the desired 3 hours' slot of following time band 00:00 hours to 03:00 hours, 03:00 hours to 06:00 hours, 06:00 hours to 09:00 hours, 09:00 hours to 12:00 hours, 12:00 hours to 15:00 hours, 15:00 hours to 18:00 hours, 18:00 hours to 21:00 hours, 21:00 hours to 24:00 hours.
 - (b) With provision of optimizing within a 10% price band, for convenience and comfort.
- iv. Employees are encouraged to book flight tickets at least 21 days prior to the intended date of travel on LTC, to avail the most competitive fares and minimize burden on the exchequer.

- v. Employees are also encouraged to avoid unnecessary cancellations. Cancellations made less than 24 hours before intended travel on LTC, will require the submission of a self-declared justification by the employee. All the three ATAs have been directed to provide zero/nil cancellation charges. Till then, cancellation charges are to be reimbursed for all cases where cancellation was due to the circumstances/reasons beyond the control of Government employee.
- Employees should preferably book only one ticket for each leg of intended travel on LTC. Holding of more than one ticket is not allowed.
- vii. While tickets may be arranged by the office through the travel agent, employees are encouraged to make ticket booking digitally through the Self Booking Tool/online booking website/portal of these 3 ATAs only. Employees must register their official Government Email-Id with these three agencies to book their air tickets digitally through above modes for travel by any airlines.
- viii. In case of unavoidable circumstances, where the booking of ticket is done from unauthorized travel agent/website, the Financial Advisors of the Ministry/Department and Head of Department not below the rank of Joint Secretary in subordinate/attached offices are authorized to grant relaxation.
- ix. No Mileage Points will be generated against travel on Government account.

Provisions for Advances

- (i) Government employees entitled for air travel, may apply for LTC advance with the print-out of the concerned webpage of authorized travel agency having suitable flight and fare details while tracking the fare of the flight under the three hour time slot, as mentioned at Para 1(iii)(a) above, at least 30 days prior to the intended date of journey.
- (ii) Government employees not entitled for air travel and wish to travel by air but not under the Special Dispensation Scheme, may apply for LTC advance with reference to Rail/Bus fare.
- (iii) Those Government employees who are not entitled for air travel but who wish to travel by air under the Special Dispensation Scheme, may apply for LTC advance with reference to Rail/Bus fare from their Headquarters/place of posting up to Kolkata/Guwahati/Chennai/Visakhapatnam/Delhi/Amritsar plus air fare (indicated in print-out of the concerned webpage of authorized travel agency having suitable flight and fare details) from the relevant railhead in Kolkata/ Guwahati/ Chennai/ Visakhapatnam/ Delhi/ Amritsar till the place of visit in North East Region/Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir/Union Territory of Andaman & Nicobar/Union Territory of Ladakh.

Provisions for Reimbursements

- (i) In case, at the time of actual booking of the ticket after receiving the advance, there is any difference in fare owing to the time gap between request for advance and grant of advance, the difference in fare will be adjusted at the time of settlement of LTC claim.
- (ii) In all cases wherein the non-entitled Government employees travel by air under Special Dispensation Scheme directly from their Headquarters/place of posting to the place of visit in NER/J&K/A&N/Ladakh, the Government employees must take the print-out of the concerned webpage having flight and fare details of the flight for relevant railhead viz. Kolkata/ Guwahati/ Delhi/Amritsar/ Chennai/ Vishakhapatnam to the place of visit viz. NER or UT of J&K or UT of Ladakh or UT of A&N within the same time-slot where the direct flight has been booked for the purpose of reimbursement. In case the flight tickets are not available in the same slot, the print out of the details of the flights available in the next slot may be retained.

In such cases, the reimbursement will be restricted to the actual air fare for the direct journey or the fare entitled under Special Dispensation Scheme, whichever is less.

(iii) Government employees not entitled for air travel and wish to travel by air but not under the Special Dispensation Scheme, are also required to book their air ticket through only the three ATAs mentioned above irrespective of booking time limit. However, the reimbursement will be restricted to the actual air fare or the entitled train/bus fare for the shortest route, whichever is less.

Subject: Modifications in instructions on booking of Air Tickets on Government Account in respect of Leave Travel Concession (LTC) – reg.

The undersigned is directed to refer to this Department's OM No. 31011/12/2022-Estt.A-IV dated 29.08.2022 regarding instructions on booking of Air Tickets in respect of Leave Travel Concession (LTC). The Department of Personnel and Training (DoPT) has been receiving a number of representations seeking clarifications on issues relating to the settlement of claims, particularly of those government employees who have not retained the screenshot of the concerned webpage of the authorised travel Agents (ATAs) during the booking of air tickets, as provided under the OM dated 29.8.2022 referred to above.

- In view of the above, the matter has been examined and with the approval
 of competent authority, the following changes/modifications in the prescribed
 procedure are made for the convenience of Government employees: -
 - (i) All three authorized travel agents, viz. M/s Balmer Lawrie & Company Limited (BLCL), M/s Ashok Travels & Tours (ATT), and Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation Ltd. (IRCTC) are to display the details of the flight having the cheapest fare and the flight(s) having the fare 10% more than the cheapest fare only, in the desired time slot, at the time of booking the air tickets by the Government employees for the purpose of LTC journey. Therefore, the booking of air ticket for the purpose of LTC on the website of these three authorized travel agents shall itself be a proof that the ticket booked by the individual government employee was of the cheapest fare as provided under the guidelines.
 - (ii) All three authorized agents shall indicate the word 'LTC' on tickets issued for the LTC journey; and
 - (iii) In all cases wherein the non-entitled Government employees are to travel by air under Special Dispensation Scheme directly from their Headquarters/place of posting to the place of visit in NER/J&K/A&N/Ladakh, the Government employees shall continue to take the print-out of the concerned webpage having flight and fare details of the flight for relevant railhead viz. Kolkata/ Guwahati/ Delhi/Amritsar/ Chennai/ Vishakhapatnam to the place of visit viz. NER or UT of J&K or UT of Ladakh or UT of A&N within the same time-slot where the direct flight has been booked for the purpose of reimbursement. In case the flight tickets are not available in the same slot, the print out of the details of the flights available in the next slot may be retained for the purpose of settlement of claims, as provided under Point (ii) of the title

"Provisions for Reimbursement" in OM dated 29.8.2022, referred to above.

- 3. Further, all the three ATAs have also been directed to allow the registration of those employees who do not have official email accounts provided their administrative office sends their details depicting their names, employee code no., private email IDs and mobile numbers, etc. to the travel agents for the purpose of booking the air tickets in respect of LTC journey.
- For the sake of convenience, the links of the three authorized travel agents are as below:
- (i) 'M/s Balmer Lawrie & Company Limited', BLCL (https://govemp.balmerlawrietravelapp.com), (ii) 'M/s Ashok Travels & Tours', 'ATT' (https://www.attitdc.in) and (iii) Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation Ltd., 'IRCTC' (https://www.air.irctc.co.in).
- 5. All the Ministries/Departments are once again advised to bring it to the notice of all their employees that any misuse of LTC shall be viewed seriously and appropriate action as deemed fit under the relevant rules will be taken against the defaulting employees. In order to keep a check on any kind of misuse of LTC, Ministries/Departments are advised to randomly get some of the air tickets submitted by the officials verified by the airlines concerned with regard to the actual cost of air travel vis-a-vis the cost indicated on the air tickets submitted by the officials.

Subject: Justification for the procurement of a 200 kV HR-PETEM instrument despite its escalated price

It is noted that the price quoted by the vendor (JEOL India Pvt. Ltd.) is higher than our estimated budget by 35.8% and exceeds the 20% cap for any new procurement as per our institute policy. However, considering the high utility of our existing 200 kV (IR-FETEM) (procured in 2016) and its age, it is of utmost priority that our institute procure another such instrument as soon as possible. Here are some of the key goints in justification for the procurement of this instrument:

High Utilization of Current FETEM: The existing FETEM is being used by approximately 98 faculty members (#Annexure 1) of our institute. The number of scholars conducting experimental research is also growing with time. The current walting time for each supervisor to characterize one sample is usually two weeks. Consequently, the walting time for each scholar/student is much longer (approx. 2-3 months). This increases the total time required to execute a research idea or à project. Additionally, this instrument has been in severe demand from institutes across the country, particularly from the northeastern part. Considering the interests of the researchers at IIT Guwahati and researchers from other institutionally urges its purchase.

Benchmark with Other Institutes: All major fits and top research Institutes in our country hou than one FETEM instrument, Including high-end aberration-corrected FETEM, atomic resolution FETEM, cryogenic FETEM, cold FEG FETEM, and FETEMs capable of in situ studies. These TEMs are much more expensive than the one we are proposing, in order to cope with the research standards of the other institutions and IIT Guwahati, being one of the major fits, we should aim to house more such TEMs to enhance and upgrade research activities. Relying on a single instrument could lead to longer waiting periods in the event of an unexpected breakdown.

Attracting Future R&D Projects: The procurement of this high-end technical specification instrument, the 200 kV HR-FETEM, will attract future R&D projects while aiding in the execution of numerous existing projects at IIT Guwahati.

Cost Justification: The old FETEM housed in CIF was purchased at an approximate cost of 10,03,117 USD in 2016. The new FETEM under consideration, costing 13,07,710 USD (including all taxes and levies), has higher-end specifications compared to the old FETEM, contributing to its higher cost (Annexure #2). Additionally, recent government rules impose an extra 18% IGST on the purchase of the new FETEM, which was not levied during the procurement of the old FETEM.

Manpower Provision: In the procurement of the new FETEM, provisions have been made to engage manpower for five years to ensure smooth operations and minimize breakdowns. In contrast, the provision for manpower with the old FETEM was only for one year. This has also added to the cost of the instrument.

In light of the above, CIF would like to recommend the procurement of the 200 kV HR-FETEM with the same specifications to the competent authority. This will maintain our state-of-the-art capabilities for future high-end R&D projects and immensely benefit the entire ITG scientific community.
